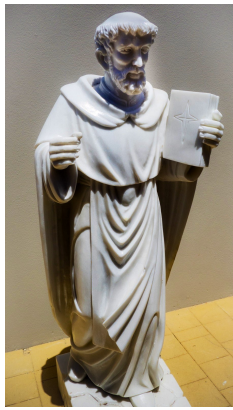

THE JOURNEY OF ST DOMINIC'S STATUE



A new statue of St Dominic has made its way safely from the Marble Mountains of Vietnam to our hillside parish church of Doubleview. Commissioned by our former parish priest, Fr Peter Nguyen, the statue is the centrepiece of the entrance to the newly-completed Rosary Community Centre.

The centre is part of the new complex that also includes the priory, offices and meeting venues next to our heritage-honoured church.

The half-tonne, life-size statue, modelled on a much admired rendition of St Dominic at a convent in Tagaytay near Manila in the Philippines, has been a work in progress for almost a year.

It was carved by a team at the leading sculpture manufacturer, Le Phat, in Vietnam's Da Nang province.

Sister Maria Du Nguyen of the Dominican Sisters' convent in Saigon supervised the commission from the factory which is about half an hour away. It's run by a cousin of one of her nuns and has supplied many statues and sculptures to the convent and to customers worldwide.

Sr Maria says of Le Phat: "He is the chief sculptor and the best."

Da Nang is famous for its magnificent white marble and has a long history as a source of statues. It was colonised by the French in 1858 who ranked it alongside Hanoi, Saigon, Haiphong, and Hue, as one of Indochina's five major centres. In 1936, French archaeologists established the Cham Museum, which houses a fine collection of Champa Kingdom-era statues, reliefs and other artwork depicting daily life from the fourth to fourteenth centuries.

The Marble Mountains are a cluster of five hills made from limestone and marble in coastal Da Nang province south of the city. The area is renowned for stone-cutting and sculpture. Its "carving village" is known as the home of Vietnamese marble, a metamorphosed rock of outstanding quality.

"We chose the best marble in Vietnam to make St Dominic," says Sr Maria. The team of sculptors modelled the design on a photo she supplied from her Filipino travels in 2012.

She ordered it in the first half of last year and it took about three months to sculpt and then another month to ship to port. It arrived in an open timber crate and plastic wrapping at Fremantle harbour in mid-October.

The parish building team took delivery of it in November but had to initially store it on the front steps of the church. Four days before Christmas, they managed to move it close to its final destination in a courtyard behind the entrance of the new community centre.

Two months later a system was devised for freeing the statue from its crate and timber pallet base, using a gantry, chain block and sling.

Under the guidance of current parish priest Fr Peter Hoang, St Dominic was lowered to the ground and gently manoeuvred into position. The sculpture features a timber walking staff which will be ceremoniously placed in the pilgrim preacher's open hand as part of the blessing and official opening of the priory and community centre after the 10 o'clock Sunday morning Mass.
