THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

Our chief guide through the Easter season is the gospel-writer John, but first we pause to hear Luke's sequel to his story of the two disciples on their way to Emmaus. This further appearance of the crucified and risen One opens up a new and limitless horizon for the followers of Jesus; they are to bear witness to him by preaching "repentance for the forgiveness of sin ... to all the nations".

Pope Francis extended this missionary mandate to all of us: "Every Christian is challenged, here and now, to be actively engaged in evangelisation; indeed, anyone who has truly experienced God's saving love does not need much time or lengthy training to go out and proclaim that love. Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus; we no longer say that we are 'disciples' or 'missionaries', but rather that we are always 'missionary disciples." He throws down the gauntlet to us: "So what are we waiting for?"

A READING FROM THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE

The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread.

They were still talking about this when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you!' In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they could not believe it and they stood dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes.

Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms, has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them,'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'

Commentary on the Gospel

Today's gospel falls into two parts. The first establishes the reality of the resurrection by emphasising the physical in terms that are reminiscent of John's gospel. As he does for Thomas, Jesus shows the disciples his hands and feet; and as he cooks fish for the disciples by the sea of Galilee, so he eats fish before them in Jerusalem.

In the second part Jesus repeats what he did for the disciples on the way to Emmaus. He recalls and reinterprets the scriptures for them, not only so that they can come to grips with what has already happened — his death and resurrection — but also to be prepared for the future.

PARENT TALK BY FATHER GREG DONOVAN

Father Greg Donovan will again be talking to the parents of children who will be receiving the sacraments this year. His talk last year was extremely interesting and enlightening.

'Fr Donovan is a priest of the Archdiocese of Perth. He was ordained in 1981 and, apart from the last two years, has worked full time in parish ministry and is involved in presenting talks to parents of children preparing to receive the sacraments. He also presents Professional Development Days for teachers and retreats for Religious. Over the past several years he has worked and lived with asylum-seekers and refugees.'
