SAINT MATTHIAS, APOSTLE

Feast day 14 May

After the Ascension of Jesus, Saint Peter proposed to the assembled faithful that they choose a disciple of Christ to fill the place of the traitor Judas in the first missionary band. Lots were drawn, with the result in favour of Matthias. According to one ancient tradition, this missionary laboured in Ethiopia and was martyred there. Thus did Saint Matthias receive "*the crown of life which God has promised to those who love him.*" The Church venerates Saint Matthias on an equal footing with the other Apostles, whose voices resound throughout the world, from generation to generation, giving testimony of what they saw and heard in their life with our Lord. His name is mentioned in the Canon of the Mass.

Everybody wants end of life choices and nobody wants to die in pain. Recently Victoria passed Voluntary Assisted Dying legislation following months of divisive debate about what should – and shouldn't – be part of end of life care.

Join us for this event, in which Dr Dan Fleming will invite us to consider the importance of clear and careful ethical thinking when it comes to end of life care, walk us through Victoria's new legislation and its implications for Catholic health services, and ultimately invite us to consider what beautiful and excellent care might look like for those who are near to the end of their lives. Dan's current roles both within St Vincent's and as newly appointed chair of Catholic Health Australia's taskforce for responding to the legislation in Victoria, combined with his academic background, will bring unique insights to our consideration of these crucial questions here in WA.

Dr Fleming is Group Manager - Ethics and Formation for St Vincent's Health Australia. He holds a PhD in moral philosophy and theology and is the author of over 30 publications in areas related to these fields. He is well known for his interactive, clear and thought-provoking presentation style — and for not shying away from the big and controversial issues that rest at the heart of healthcare ethics. **A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL
ACCORDING TO MARK**

Jesus showed himself to the Eleven, and said to them, 'Go out to the whole world, proclaim the Good News to all creation. He who believes and is baptised will be saved; he who does not believe will be condemned. These are the signs that will be associated with believers: in my name they will cast out devils; they will have the gift of tongues; they will pick up snakes in their hands, and be unharmed should they drink deadly poison; they will lay their hands on the sick, who will recover.'

And so the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven: there at the right hand of God he took his place, while they, going out, preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word by the signs that accompanied it.

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

In spite of their reluctance to believe, the disciples are commissioned to go forth and proclaim the gospel "to the whole creation". They are assured that their preaching will be accompanied by powerful signs. Mark devotes but a single sentence to Jesus' ascension; his focus is on the earthly mission of the disciples. It is as if Jesus had to withdraw to allow the mission to succeed.
