# PENTECOST

The feast of Pentecost brings the season of Easter to a glorious close. Though we hear Luke telling us today that the Spirit was bestowed fifty days after the resurrection, we know that we've already spent the entire Easter season "In the Spirit". The reason for this is made clear by the gospel reading. In John's version of events, Jesus breathed out his spirit on the disciples on the very day of his resurrection, "the first day of the week". Each writer has a theological perspective that accounts for his particular chronology.

We have not spent the last seven weeks waiting for the Spirit. The feast of Pentecost allows us to cry a final full-hearted "Alleluia!" for all the Spirit has accomplished in us and will continue to do. We pray with fresh fervour the same response to the psalm that followed the story of creation at the Easter Vigil fifty days ago: "Lord, send out your Spirit and renew the face of the earth".

# MASS AT REGIS



The Feast Day of **Our Lady, Help of Christians** has been celebrated in Australia since 1844 but the history to this day, dates back to the start of the 1800's at a time when Napoleon Bonaparte had gaoled Pius VI (who died in gaol). And later, when Pope Pius VII was elected he too was gaoled by Bonaparte, who kept him prisoner at Fontainebleau.

The Holy Father vowed to God that if he were restored to the Roman See, he would institute a special feast in honour of Mary. The military eventually forced Bonaparte to release the Pope and on 24 May, 1814 Pius VII returned in triumph to Rome.

Twelve months later the Pope decreed that the Feast of Our Lady Mary Help of Christians be kept on 24 May.

The infant church in Australia had a special reason for turning to Mary. No priests were sent to the colony in its early days and Mass was not allowed, except for one brief year, until 1820. It was largely the Rosary in those early days that kept the faith alive. The Australian Catholic community remained faithful to Mary, and Australia was the first nation to choose her under the title, 'Mary Help of Christians' as principle Patroness.

#### **LEARNING FROM THE VICTORIAN EXPERIENCE OF END OF LIFE LEGISLATION**

Monday 28 May 2018 6pm - 7.30pm Notre Dame University Santa Maria Lecture Theatre Mouat Street. Fremantle

Presenter: Dr Dan Fleming Approved by His Grace.

Everybody wants end of life choices and nobody wants to die in pain. Recently Victoria passed Voluntary Assisted Dying legislation following months of divisive debate about what should – and shouldn't – be part of end of life care.

Join us for this event, in which Dr Dan Fleming will invite us to consider the importance of clear and careful ethical thinking when it comes to end of life care, walk us through Victoria's new legislation and its implications for Catholic health services, and ultimately invite us to consider what beautiful and excellent care might look like for those who are near to the end of their lives. Dan's current roles both within St Vincent's and as newly appointed chair of Catholic Health Australia's taskforce for responding to the legislation in Victoria, combined with his academic background, will bring unique insights to our consideration of these crucial questions here in WA.

Dr Fleming is Group Manager - Ethics and Formation for St Vincent's Health Australia. He holds a PhD in moral philosophy and theology and is the author of over 30 publications in areas related to these fields. He is well know for his interactive, clear and thought-provoking presentation style — and for not shying away from the big and controversial issues that rest at the heart of healthcare ethics.
