THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

Today's observance originated in the Belgian city of Liege in the 13th century. Very soon after, in 1264, Pope Urban IV decreed that the feast be celebrated by the whole Western Church. From its beginnings through to the reforms of the Second Vatican Council, the popular focus of the feast was on the presence of Christ in the consecrated bread, the Blessed Sacrament. This narrow understanding is still reflected in the fact that many still call the feast by its original Latin name, Corpus Christi.

Today the word of God explicitly directs our attention to the Blood of Christ. It is by our communion in the Body and Blood of Christ that we enter into the whole mystery of Jesus' self-gift to us in the eucharistic meal. The eucharist is not a sacred object but first and foremost an action that engages our body, mind, heart and soul. It calls us to break the bread and pour out the wine of our lives for the sake of the world.

SPECIAL FEASTS

June 5th : SAINT BONIFACE

Born in Devon England about 675 Boniface was a monk and teacher who went to evangelise the Germanic peoples. He was ordained a bishop and given wide-ranging papal commissions throughout Germany and Gaul. He founded monasteries, established dioceses, and presided at synods. He is remembered as a determined missionary and as a Church organiser and reformer whose work shaped the future of Europe. He is buried at his abbey of Fulda and is honoured as Apostle of Germany

June 8th : MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS

This devotion, which dates back to the Middle Ages, flowered in France in the seventeenth century as a result of the visions of Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque. The feast was extended to the entire Western Church by Pius IX in 1856. It recalls the mystery of God who is love, and honours the heart of Jesus as the source and centre of the incarnate love of God.

June 9th : THE IMMACULATE HEART OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

This commemoration celebrates Mary as the model of ready acceptance of God's will in all life's circumstances. It is celebrated on the Saturday following the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

PLENARY COUNCIL 2020 – LISTEN TO WHAT THE SPIRIT IS SAYING.

Pope Francis has approved the Australian Bishops' decision to hold a Plenary Council in Australia in 2020 and 2021. It is a significant moment for the Church in Australia to make decisions about the future.

Archbishop Costelloe has been appointed as President of the Plenary Council by Pope Francis and as Chairman of the Bishops' Commission on the Plenary.

In the coming months, as a parish community, we will gather together to listen to one another, to reflect on this question and share our own stories of faith, and our experiences of the Church. After we talk together, we will collate our stories and ideas and the questions we have about the future of the Church in Australia and give our submissions online through the Plenary Council webpage. This can be done as individuals, in groups or as a parish.

COMMUNITY GARDEN PROJECT

SET TO GROW

Our parish has launched a campaign to raise funds for a new landscaping project alongside the church and recently-opened meeting and residential complex.

Capital works leader Paul Roberts has a target of \$100,000 to fulfil the vision for the Rosary Community Garden drawn up by parishioner and botanical advisor Lydia Ellis.

Lydia has produced three artist's impressions of the garden which will be dedicated to Mary and the rosary.

Plantings will reflect the colours of each of the four decades of the rosary and the ground treatment will incorporate the pattern of a giant cross. A combination of soft and durable surfaces will be featured.

Our Lady's statue, formerly located in a bush grotto alongside the church, has been restored and will be permanently placed in an elevated position in the new community garden.

Paul Roberts has begun discussions with Holy Rosary School and Newman College to seek support for the project.

Parishioners will kept informed of the progress of the garden and have the opportunity to be involved, including contributing to particular features such as seating, trees, other plants, inscriptions and paving.

Paul says the Rosary Community Garden will eventually cater for many uses including spaces for small gatherings, quiet contemplation, prayers, post-sacramental photography and barbecues. A new memorial wall will be installed on one side.

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL
ACCORDING TO MARK

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to Jesus, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the passover?' So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which he enters, "The Master says: Where is my dining room in which I can eat the passover with my disciples?" He will show you a large upper room furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the preparations for us there.' The disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and prepared the Passover.

And as they were eating he took some bread, and when he said the blessing he broke it and gave it to them. 'Take it,' he said, 'this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and when he had returned thanks he gave it to them, and all drank from it, and he said to them, 'This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many. I tell you solemnly, I shall not drink any more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God.'
