ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Early in his gospel Mark observes that people were “astounded at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes.” As the gospel unfolds we find that Jesus does much of his teaching in parables.

This is what Gerhard Lohfink says in his book *Jesus of Nazareth: What He wanted, Who He Was*: “Jesus was a master of brief, striking sayings and skilled at telling stories in images and parables. ... [These] have never been equalled in quality ... With them he leads his listeners into a world with which they are already familiar or at least one that they have heard about ... But at the same time he makes that world alien, thus blows up the well-worn paths of customary pious thinking. Jesus wants to show that the reign of God has its own logic” (p120).

No wonder that the question was raised as to whether Jesus was hiding or revealing the truth when he spoke in parables! They never cease to intrigue us and invite us into his unique way of seeing the world.

SPECIAL FEASTS

June 21 : SAINT ALOYSIUS GONZAGA

Born in Lombardy (Italy) in 1568 to a family of Italian nobility, Aloysius was devout from a very early age. He pursued a religious vocation as a Jesuit against enormous family opposition. He died on this day in 1591 of the plague, contracted while caring for its victims. He is remembered for his youthful ideal of perfection and his determination to achieve it.

June 22 : SAINTS JOHN FISHER & THOMAS MORE

John Fisher was born in Beverley, England in 1469. He was Chancellor at Cambridge and Bishop at Rochester, combining diligent pastoral ministry with the defence of Catholic doctrine.

Thomas More was born in London in 1478. He was an Oxford scholar, a noted humanist and apologist, an incorruptible judge and Lord Chancellor, a devoted husband and loving father.

Drawn into conflict with Henry VIII, both were imprisoned and beheaded for treason in 1535. They are remembered for their wide learning, for their devotion to the Church, and for their uncompromising integrity and courage.

**A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL
ACCORDING TO MARK**

Jesus said to the crowd, 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time; he starts to reap because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.'

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.
