EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN **ORDINARY TIME**

Amid the constant bombardment of advertising that promotes convenience foods, there are also plenty of warnings about the dangers they pose our health. To pay attention to these is to discover that much of the processed food that we eat has little nutritional value. Worse still it is usually riddled with ingredients that are guite detrimental to our health.

Is there a parallel with the food we feed to our minds? Do we think twice about whether it's nourishing or just junk? Does what we read and talk about feed our hearts with wisdom and truth and love, or does it go to maintain our anxieties and reinforce our negative attitudes? This is the question raised for us by Jesus' exchange with the crowd after they have been fed. On what do we feed? What do we truly hunger and thirst for, and what steps do we take to nurture our inmost selves? Today's word of God offers us the opportunity to look again.

A READING FROM THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN

When the people saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they got into boats and crossed to Capernaum to look for Jesus. When they found him on the other side, they said to him, 'Rabbi, when did you come here?' Jesus answered:

'I tell you most solemnly, you are not looking for me because you have seen the signs but because you had all the bread you wanted to eat. Do not work for food that cannot last, but work for food that endures to eternal life, the kind of food the Son of Man is offering you, for on him the Father, God himself, has set his seal.'

Then they said to him 'What must we do if we are to do the works that God wants?' Jesus gave them this answer. 'This is working for God: you must believe in the one he has sent.' So they said, 'What sign will you give to show us that we should believe in you? What work will you do? Our fathers had manna to eat in the desert; as scripture says: He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'

Jesus answered:

'I tell you solemnly, it was not Moses who gave you bread from heaven, it is my Father who gives you the bread from heaven, the true bread; for the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.'

'Sir,' they said, 'give us that bread always.' Jesus answered:

'I am the bread of life.

He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never thirst.'

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

Time and again in the gospel of John, questions are put to Jesus that he never answers directly. Instead he responds obliquely with teaching that provokes further questioning.

In this passage, the people ask three questions: how did you get here? how can we do the works of God? what sign will you give us? Jesus replies to each in turn: work for the food of eternal life; the work of God is to believe in him; my Father gives you true bread from heaven. In no case does he allow the question to determine his answer. He is in charge of the dialogue. Essentially each of his replies is telling the people that they are asking the wrong question. Jesus keeps leading his audience deeper and deeper into unknown territory.


SPECIAL FEASTS:

AUGUST 6: THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD

This feast had its origin the East in the fourth century as the commemoration of the dedication of the church of the Transfiguration on Mount Tabor. The feast celebrates the divine radiance shining in Christ's human flesh and God's glory shining forth in the lives of Christians.

August 8: Saint Mary of The Cross, Virgin Mary MacKillop was born in Melbourne in 1842. Responding to the isolation of colonial families she pioneered a new form of religious life to provide education for their children. She and her sisters shared the life of the poor and the itinerant, offering special care to destitute women and children. She is remembered for her eagerness to discover God's will in all things, for her charity in the face of calumny, and for her abiding trust in God's providence. She died in Sydney on this day in 1909 and was named Australia's second patron saint in 2013.


WINTER APPEAL
