TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Once upon a time it was a familiar catechism question. Is it a sin to *miss* Mass on Sunday? It's illuminating to turn the question on its head. Is it a sin to *go* to Mass on Sunday? This may seem like a strange question but its worth pondering. Some of today's readings suggest the answer could be yes.

Jesus quotes the prophet Isaiah to condemn worship that is just outward observance, worship that doesn't arise from true hearts. And the author of the letter of James defines pure religion not in terms of church going but as "coming to the help of orphans and widows".

This is the constant danger that practising Christians face, the risk that the rituals of worship will substitute for living out the demands of the gospel for justice and mercy. The marriage of liturgy and justice is always in peril. Worship that does not fire our passion for justice is counterfeit; work for justice that does not impel us to the common table of word and sacrament may end in burnout.

A READING FROM THE GOSPEL **ACCORDING TO MARK**

The Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered round Jesus, and they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with unclean hands, that is, without washing them. For the Pharisees, and the Jews in general, follow the tradition of the elders and never eat without washing their arms as far as the elbow; and on returning from the market place they never eat without first sprinkling themselves. There are also many other observances which have been handed down to them concerning the washing of cups and pots and bronze dishes. So these Pharisees and scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not respect the tradition of the elders but eat their food with unclean hands?' He answered, 'It was of you hypocrites that Isaiah so rightly prophesied in this passage of scripture:

This people honours me only with lip-service, while their hearts are far from me. The worship they offer me is worthless, the doctrines they teach are only human regulations. You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.'

He called the people to him again and said, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean; it is the things that come out of a man that make him unclean. For it is from within, from men's hearts, that evil intentions emerge; fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, malice, deceit, indecency, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these things come from within and make a man unclean.'

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

By quoting Isaiah, Jesus identifies himself with the prophets who minced no words in exposing the hypocrisy of people who made a display of their religious observance while exploiting and oppressing the poor. The list of vices he cites has many parallels in the writings of the New Testament. Much of this passage is couched in negative terms but the real message is clearly positive. What Jesus exemplifies in himself and calls us to, is complete integrity of life.

SPECIAL FEASTS

September 3: SAINT GREGORY THE GREAT

Born about 540 and died in Rome in 604. While prefect of Rome, he founded monasteries there and in Sicily and himself became a monk. He was elected pope in 590. He is remembered for his extensive writings on pastoral care, spirituality, and morals and for his self-designation as 'servant of the servants of God.'

September 8 : THE NATIVITY OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

This feast originated in Jerusalem about the sixth century, a development of the feast of the dedication of the church of Saint Anne, built in Jerusalem 'where Mary was born'. Observed in Rome in the seventh century, it was later used to determine the date of Mary's Immaculate Conception. Because of her importance in salvation history, Mary's birthday is celebrated as well as those of her son, Jesus the Lord, and of Saint John the Baptist (June 24).

The Australian Catholic Bishops along with Catholic Religious Australia have agreed to release the Church's formal response to the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse by the end of the month.
