<u>A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL</u> <u>ACCORDING TO JOHN</u>

'Are you the king of the Jews?' Pilate asked. Jesus replied, 'Do you ask this of your own accord or have others spoken to you about me?' Pilate answered, 'Am I a Jew? It is your own people and the chief priests who have handed you over to me: what have you done?' Jesus replied, 'Mine is not a kingdom of this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my men would have fought to prevent my being surrendered to the Jews. But my kingdom is not of this kind.' 'So you are a king then?' said Pilate. 'It is you who say it' answered Jesus. 'Yes, I am a king. I was born for this, I came into the world for this: to bear witness to the truth, and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice.

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

Today's reading presents the first exchange between Pilate and Jesus inside the fortress. The key issue emerges: the true identity of Jesus and the nature of his kingship.

Prior to the passion narrative, the term "king" only appears four times in this gospel. On each occasion it's clear that the term expresses false expectations of Jesus' messiahship. By contrast, the word is used ten times in the passion story, three of which are in this passage, along with three references to "kingdom". John has already demonstrated the nature of Jesus' kingship in the story of the washing of the feet. It's a kingship of love, a love so powerful that it will overcome death. Now Jesus declares his kingdom to be a realm of truth, the kind of truth that "will make you free" (8:32).

November 30: ST ANDREW, APOSTLE

According to the New Testament, Andrew was born in the village of Bethsaida by the Sea of Galilee during the early first century. He was a fisherman and perhaps a disciple of John the Baptist. He introduced his brother, Simon Peter to Jesus and became one of the first to follow Christ. Since ancient times Saint Andrew has been widely venerated and remembered as one of the twelve who bore witness to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. St. Andrew is the patron saint of fishermen and singers.

PLENARY COUNCIL 2020

A Plenary Council is the highest form of gathering that a church in a particular country can have. It is a process by which lay people and clergy can be heard. The last one took place more than eighty years ago in 1937.

A Plenary is different from an assembly, in that it has legislative power, i.e, the final decisions of a Plenary council become law and have binding power. The responsibility of making these decisions falls on the conference of bishops after listening and discerning the leading of the Holy Spirit.

There will be "open dialogue and listening sessions". Each person's perspective will be valued. No individual has an infallible sense of the faith. We only have a sense of what God is wanting by allowing as many as possible to have a voice in the conversation God wants to have with the church. Singly we see a special viewpoint; together we see much more.



WHAT IS AN EXTRAORDINARY MINISTER OF HOLY COMMUNION (EMoHC)?

The term *extraordinary* shows how words in our language can be used in so many different ways. In this case, it is used as the minister is EXTRA to the "ordinary" who is the priest. (Extra-ORDINARY.... not extraordinary!)

'The role of special ministers is to serve the assembly by distributing Holy Communion during the Communion Rite, so they are called "Ministers of Communion" not "Eucharistic Ministers". The latter term should be used only to refer to the ordained minister, the one who presides at the Eucharist. Ministers of Communion are described as extra-ordinary because the ordinary ministers of communion are bishops, priests and deacons, that is, those who have been admitted to holy orders.' *(Liturgy Brisbane)*
