PROCLAIMERS OF THE WORD

This ministry is properly called the ministry of **Proclaimers of the Word**, because the Word of God is not meant to be simply read, but to be proclaimed as living word of life. For this reason this ministry is not to be called the ministry of readers.

Scripture itself tells us that God's word is "living and active." His Word is not primarily a written text that is fixed and codified, but a Word spoken and proclaimed in the midst of a community of faith.

SPECIAL FEAST DAY

December 8:

THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

This Feast had its origin in the East as the 'Conception of Mary by Saint Anne'. It spread through the West during the Middle Ages as the 'Immaculate Conception' and was extended to the entire Western Church in the eighteenth century. The feast celebrates Mary, preserved from sin from the moment of conception; she is the first fruits of her Son's redemption and a prophetic model of what the Church is called to be.
