<u>A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL</u> <u>ACCORDING TO LUKE</u>

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.

COMMENTARY OF THE GOSPEL

This reading falls into two parts. The first consists of practical advice as to what those who wish to repent must do. People must share their food and clothing, and tax collectors and soldiers must not resort to extortion. The dangerous appeal of wealth will become a recurrent theme in Luke's gospel.

The second part introduces a radical distinction between the Baptiser and the Messiah to come. John baptises with water for repentance, the one who is to come will baptise with the Holy Spirit and fire. The context suggests that the fire that John has in mind is the fire of divine judgement rather than that of Pentecost. Once imprisoned John himself appears to succumb to doubt that Jesus is the one he foreshadowed (Lk7:18-35)

In contrasting John and Jesus, Luke and the other evangelists may be appealing to those who may have retained an allegiance to John and have not become followers of Jesus. All the same Luke describes the Baptist's preaching as good news.
