Why is it that Jesus undergoes baptism from John? Clearly it is something that has to be explained to the early Christian communities, as at first glance the baptism appears to set Jesus under John!

Recognising this, Luke is at pains to speak of John as seeing himself as a forerunner to Christ but not as the Christ. John is not the one to come, but sets the path for him. But still Jesus undergoes his baptism, along with many others. However, for Jesus this is not a moment of forgiveness of sins or repentance. Rather, John the Baptist represents to the age the role and mission of a prophet; one who speaks the words of God to the people. Jesus, recognising this, seeks to begin his own mission in the path of John: Jesus sees himself as a prophet who will speak the word of God to the people. Jesus' baptism by John allows Jesus to be recognised by the people as a prophet, and guides both their expectations of him and his own direction as a teacher and healer. Across the Gospel Jesus will speak, act, heal and respond within the framework of one of the prophets of Israel. ...

For the early Christian audience, Jesus is not just a prophet, he is THE prophet. ...

THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire'.

Now when all the people had been baptised and while Jesus after his own baptism was at prayer, heaven opened and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily shape, like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "you are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you."
