### **FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT**

Is there a parent who hasn't had to find an answer for the child who asks, "Are we nearly there yet?" It's a question we might well be asking ourselves at this stage of our Lenten journey. Perhaps it's time to recall the words of a preface for Lent, as it used to be prayed: "Each year you give us this joyful season when we prepare to celebrate the paschal mystery with mind and heart renewed."

Yes, it's a joyful season, a time of renewal. It's a gift, a grace, We don't journey alone — we have the companionship of the whole Church along the way. For the whole community of faith Lent is a fresh opportunity to be set free, to discover what our deepest desire really is.

# A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. At daybreak he appeared in the Temple again; and as all the people came to him, he sat down and began to teach them.

The scribes and Pharisees brought a woman along who had been caught committing adultery; and making her stand there in full view of everybody, they said to Jesus, 'Master, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery, and Moses has ordered us in the Law to condemn women like this death by stoning. What have you to say?' They asked him this as a test, looking for something to use against him. But Jesus bent down and started writing on the ground with his finger. As they persisted with their question, he looked up and said, 'If there is one of you who has not sinned, let him be the first to throw a stone at her.' Then he bent down and wrote on the ground again. When they heard this they went away one by one, beginning with the eldest, until Jesus was left alone with the woman, who remained standing there. He look up and said, 'woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?' 'No one, sir,' she replied. 'Neither do I condemn you,' said Jesus, 'go away, and don't sin any more.'

## Commentary On The Gospel

This is a gem of a short story. It is a one-act drama with three scenes — the accusing action of the scribes and Pharisees, Jesus' converse with them, and Jesus' dialogue with the woman.

After all these years the appeal of the story remains undimmed. The hypocrisy of the authorities in using the woman to try and trap Jesus, the blatant absence of the male perpetrator, the wise but mysterious way Jesus deals with the dilemma put to him and his compassionate treatment of the woman — all these features of the story are vividly and economically sketched.

Jesus' final words to the woman, now addressed to us, are both gift ("Neither do I condemn you") and task ("Go away, and don't sin any more").
