THE FEAST OF ST DOMINIC

Born at Calaruega (Spain) about 1170, Dominic was an Augustinian canon noted for prayer, penance, and an exemplary life. In a time of violent crusades he sought reconciliation through instruction and prayer.

He established the **Order of Preachers** (Dominicans) to revitalise the Church through study, teaching, preaching, and prayer. He is remembered as a preacher, organiser, and patron of learning. He died at Bologna (Italy) on

6 August 1221.

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE

A man in the crowd said to Jesus, 'Master, tell my brother to give me a share of our inheritance.' 'My friend,' he replied, 'who appointed me your judge, or the arbitrator of your claims?' Then he said to them, 'Watch, and be on your guard against avarice of any kind, for a man's life is not made secure by what he owns, even when he has more than he needs.

Then he told them a parable: 'There was once a rich man who, having a good harvest from his land, thought to himself, "What am I to do? I have not enough room to store my crops" Then he said, "This is what I will do: I will pull down my barns and build bigger ones, and store all my grain and my goods in them, and I will say to my soul: 'My soul, you have plenty of good things laid by for many years to come; take things easy, eat, drink, have a good time." But God said to him, "Fool! This very night the demand will be made for your soul; and this hoard of yours, whose will it be then?" So it is when a man stores up treasure for himself in place of making himself rich in the sight of God."

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

This reading falls into two parts. Jesus' teaching on avarice, prompted by a request for intervention in a family property dispute, is followed by a parable that illustrates this teaching. It all culminates in the concluding saying — What matters is to make oneself "rich in the sight of God".

Elsewhere Luke makes it clear that it is poverty of spirit that God reckons as wealth. Insofar as the acquisition and harbouring of material wealth is driven by anxiety and fear, it is at odds with humble trust in God's providential goodness. Patient steadfast trust in God can alone bring the security that we falsely seek in possessions.

In an age when young and old are bombarded ceaselessly with advertising which aggravates status anxiety, and when there is a boom in storage centres for excess possession, this teaching is as pertinent as ever.
