TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Courtesy of both mainstream and social media, we are all too familiar with barbaric acts of terrorism claimed to have been carried out in the name of religion. How true it is that religious fanaticism has been the driving force behind these atrocities is very hard to know. But one thing is certain. They have given critics of religion plenty of ammunition. The cry is for a benign and tolerant humanism set free from the claims of religious dogmas and moral dictates.

Tolerance has a powerful appeal. Insofar as it is fed by a genuine respect for others and their innate goodness, it well serves the common good. But if it implies that there is no ultimate truth or value by which human beings are to plot their course in life, then it can sow the seeds of indifference, division, and even chaos.

What then do we make of Jesus' declaration that he has come to cause division, even in the heart of the social unit that is the family? He isn't making a gentle appeal for mutual acceptance. On the contrary he is predicting divisive conflict. This will follow, he implies, when his claim for complete allegiance is taken up. Have we dared to take him seriously? Isn't it true that most of us run far more risk of lapsing into indifference than of being propelled into religious extremism? Is it time to take the risk of answering Jesus' call?

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I have come to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were blazing already! There is a baptism I must still receive, and how great is my distress till it is over!

'Do you suppose that I am here to bring peace on earth? No, I tell you, but rather division. For from now on a household of five will be divided: three against two and two against three; the father divided against the son, son against father, mother against daughter, daughter against mother, mother-in-law against daughter-in-law, daughter-in-law against mother-in-law.'

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

Today's gospel text is an exceptionally anguished cry of distress from the heart of Jesus. The whole passage has a prophetic tone to it. It was often the unhappy task of the prophet to warn and threaten and pronounce judgement. For some, like Jeremiah, this entailed great personal suffering.

Jesus' warning that his mission would bring division rather than peace is all the more startling because the promise of peace is a recurring theme in Luke. These contrary words of Jesus are spoken as he steadfastly continues his fateful journey to Jerusalem. He has made his decision and knows it will pit him against the powers that be. Those who choose to believe in him will find themselves at odds even with those closest to them.

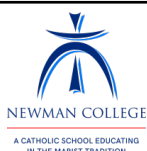
