A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

Jesus put a parable before the crowds, ‘The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who has sowed good seed in his field. While everybody was asleep his enemy came, sowed darnel all among the wheat, and made off. When the new wheat sprouted and ripened, the darnel appeared as well. The owner’s servants went to him and said, “Sir, was it not good seed that you sowed in your field? If so, where does the darnel come from?” “Some enemy has done this” he answered. And the servants said, “Do you want us to go and weed it out?” But he said, “No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it. Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my barn.”

He put another parable before them, ‘The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed which a man took and sowed in his field. It is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the biggest shrub of all and becomes a tree so that the birds of the air come and shelter in its branches.’

He told them another parable, ‘The kingdom of heaven is like the yeast a woman took and mixed in with three measure of flour till it was leavened all through.

In all this Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables; indeed he would never speak to them except in parables. This was to fulfil the prophecy:

I will speak to you in parables and expound things hidden since the foundation of the world.

Then, leaving the crowds, he went to the house; and his disciples came to him and said, ‘Explain the parable about the darnel in the field to us.’ He said in reply, ‘The sower of the good seed is the Son of Man. The field is the world; the good seed is the subjects of the kingdom; the darnel, the subjects of the evil one; the enemy who sowed them, the devil; the harvest is the end of the world; the reapers are the angels. Well then, just as the darnel is gathered up and burnt in the fire, so it will be at the end of time. The Son of Man will send his angels and they will gather out of his kingdom all things that provoke offences and all who do evil, and throw them into the blazing furnace, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth. Then the virtuous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Listen, anyone who has ears!

SPECIAL FEAST DAYS


JULY 22: SAINT MARY MAGDALENE

A faithful disciple of Christ, Mary administered to his needs after having seven devils cast out from her. She witnessed his crucifixion, was present at this burial, and was the first to see the risen Lord. She was commissioned by Christ to proclaim the good news of his resurrection to the apostles (John 20:17-18). She is remembered in the East as the “Apostle to the Apostles.”

JULY 25: SAINT JAMES, APOSTLE

James, born at Bethsaida in Galilee, a son of Zebedee was a fisherman, summoned by Jesus together with his brother Saint John. They were called the “Sons of Thunder”. James is remembered as a favoured apostle. With St Peter and Saint John, he was present at the transfiguration of the raising of the daughter of Jairus, and the agony in the garden. He died about the year 44, the first apostle to die, beheaded by Herod.

**Current Covid-19 precautions issued
by the Archdiocese of Perth:**

- The faithful continue to be dispensed from their obligation to attend Sunday Mass - if you feel unwell please stay at home
- Social distancing to be maintained on entering and exiting the church
- Hand sanitisers to be used as you enter the church
- Holy Water fonts to remain empty
- Physical distancing of one (1) person per two (2) square metres must be observed inside the church
- Hymnals or shared copies of texts not to be used
- Newsletters should not be re-used - either take them home or put in the bin provided as you leave
- **It is very strongly encouraged, out of concern for the health of others including the celebrant and other ministers, to refrain from receiving Holy Communion on the tongue**
- The Sign of Peace is to be given without physical contact
- Offerings to be put into boxes at the back of the church
- **A physical distance of 1.5 metres between people in the Communion Procession is to be observed.**
