

A READING FROM THE FIRST BOOK OF THE KINGS

The Lord appeared to Solomon in a dream and said, 'Ask what you would like me to give you.' Solomon replied, 'Lord, my God, you have made your servant king in succession to David my father. But I am a very young man unskilled in leadership. Your servant finds himself in the midst of this people of yours that you have chosen, a people so many its numbers cannot be counted or reckoned. Give your servant a heart to understand how to discern between good and evil, for who could govern this people of yours that is so great?' It pleased the Lord that Solomon should have asked for this. 'Since you have asked for this' the Lord said 'and not asked for long life for yourself or riches or the lives of your enemies, but have asked for a discerning judgement for yourself, here and now I do what you ask. I give you a heart wise and shrewd as none before you has had and none will have after you.'

A READING FROM THE LETTER OF ST PAUL TO THE ROMANS

We know that by turning everything to their good, God co-operates with all those who love him, with all those that he has called according to his purpose. They are the ones he chose specially long ago and intended to become true images of his Son, so that his Son might be the eldest of many brothers. He called those he intended for this; those he called he justified, and with those he justified he shared his glory.

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

Jesus said to the crowds, 'The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field which someone has found; he hides it again, goes off happy, sells everything he owns and buys the field.'

'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls; when he finds one of great value he goes and sells everything he owns and buys it.'

'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a dragnet cast into the sea that brings in a haul of all kinds. When it is full, the fishermen haul it ashore; then, sitting down, they collect the good ones in a basket and throw away those that are no use. This is how it will be at the end of time: the angels will appear and separate the wicked from the just to throw them into the blazing furnace where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth.'

'Have you understood all this?' They said, 'Yes.' And he said to them, 'Well then, every scribe who becomes a disciple of the kingdom of heaven is like a householder who brings out from his storeroom things both new and old.'

JULY 29: SAINT MARTHA

The sister of Mary and Lazarus of Bethany. Honoured for her confession of faith in the Lord in which she beseeched him to restore life to her dead brother. She is remembered too for her hospitality to Jesus and her concern for the details of service to guests.

JULY 25: SAINT IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA

Born in Loyola (Spain) in 1491 and died on this day at Rome in 1556. He founded the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) and became its first superior general. He is remembered for his loyalty to the Church and its renewal, his ministry to the marginal, his concern for education, and his 'dedication to the greater glory of God', the motto of the Jesuits.


Peers/friends/students are encouraged to watch the showreel and vote for the best clip.

**Current Covid-19 precautions issued
by the Archdiocese of Perth:**

- The faithful continue to be dispensed from their obligation to attend Sunday Mass - if you feel unwell please stay at home
- Social distancing to be maintained on entering and exiting the church
- Hand sanitisers to be used as you enter the church
- Holy Water fonts to remain empty
- Physical distancing of one (1) person per two (2) square metres must be observed inside the church
- Hymnals or shared copies of texts not to be used
- Newsletters should not be re-used - either take them home or put in the bin provided as you leave
- **It is very strongly encouraged, out of concern for the health of others including the celebrant and other ministers, to refrain from receiving Holy Communion on the tongue**
- The Sign of Peace is to be given without physical contact
- Offerings to be put into boxes at the back of the church
- **Keep a physical distance of 1.5 metres between people in the Communion Procession.**
