### TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Paul and Jesus conspire together today to present us with tough teaching. Paul counsels the Romans "not to model yourselves on the behaviour of the world ... but let your behaviour change, modelled by your new mind". Jesus rebukes Peter "because the way you think is not god's way but man's".

The choice is put before us. Do we allow ourselves to take the easy path of conformity with "the way of the world", or do we choose the way of Jesus which he warns is a way of the cross? Paul and Jesus make it clear that we do not accomplish this by our own efforts. It is by letting go of the life we imagine we have, Jesus says, that we will find true life. And Paul speaks of our minds being renewed and remodelled from within. The question is whether we will take the risk of "letting go and letting God".

### A READING FROM THE BOOK OF JEREMIAH

You have seduced me, Lord, and I have let myself be seduced;  
you have overpowered me; you were the stronger.  
I am a daily laughing-stock,  
everybody's butt.

### A READING FROM THE LETTER OF ST PAUL TO THE ROMANS

Think of God's mercy, my brothers, and worship him, I beg of you, in a way that is worthy of thinking beings, by offering your living bodies as a holy sacrifice, truly pleasing to God. Do not model yourselves on the behaviour of the world around you, but let your behaviour change, modelled by your new mind. This is the only way to discover the will of God and know what is good, what it is that God wants, what is the perfect thing to do.

### A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord,' he said. 'This must not happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life?

'For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and, when he does, he will reward each one according to his behaviour.'

## SPECIAL FEAST DAYS

### **SEPTEMBER 3: ST GREGORY THE GREAT**

Born about 540 and died in Rome in 604. While Prefect of Rome, he founded monasteries there and in Sicily, and himself became a monk. He was called to be a deacon of Rome by Benedict I, and then sent as papal legate to Constantinople. He was elected pope in 590. He reorganised Church life and administration in a time of crisis, sponsored liturgical reform, and initiated the evangelisation of the English. He is remembered also for his extensive writings on pastoral care, spirituality, and morals, and for his self-designation as 'servant of the servants of God'.

### **SEPTEMBER 5: ST TERESA OF CALCUTTA**

Born Agnes Bojaxhiu on August 26, 1910 in Macedonia. St Teresa joined the missionary order of the Sisters of Loreto in Dublin Ireland in 1928 and was given the name of Sister Mary Teresa. She travelled to India where she taught for 20 years before leaving the convent to establish an order of religious woman called *The Missionaries of Charity* and worked among the poorest of the poor. Mother Teresa, as she was known then, received a Nobel Peace Prize in 1979. She captivated the world as few other people have. Her simple message was: "We are put on earth to do something beautiful for God." Mother Teresa died on this day in 1997 and was beatified on 19 October 2003.

## UFO CRAFT GROUP

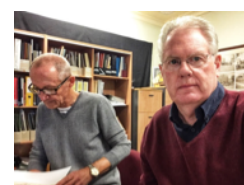
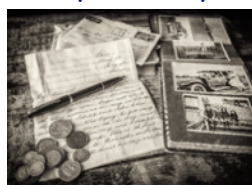
