TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

It was after the first murder recorded in the scriptures - a fratricide - that the Lord asked Cain, "Where is your brother Abel?" Cain's reply remains a byword even today, "I do not know; am I my brother's keeper?"

Cain's defiant question in reply to the Lord leads to many other questions. What responsibility do we have for the actions of others? When is it right and proper to respect others' freedom to make their own wrong choices? When are we obliged to bring others' bad behaviour to light? What is the best way to approach someone who we believe needs challenge or correction? For all the discussion that has gone into these matters, useful answers are hard to come by.

Matthew's gospel suggests a process to be followed in the community when a "brother does something wrong". No stranger to problems in Christian communities, Paul spells out the fundamental principle: "Love is the one thing that cannot hurt your neighbour."

A READING FROM THE PROPHET EZEKIEL

The word of the Lord was addressed to me as follows, 'Son of man, I have appointed you as sentry to the House of Israel. When you hear a word from my mouth, warn them in my name. If I say to a wicked man: Wicked wretch, you are to die, and you do not speak to warn the wicked man to renounce his ways, then he shall die for his sin, but I will hold you responsible for his death. If, however, you do warn a wicked man to renounce his ways and repent, and he does not repent, then he shall die for his sin, but yourself will have saved your life.'

A READING FROM THE LETTER OF ST PAUL TO THE ROMANS

Avoid getting into debt, except the debt of mutual love. If you love your fellow men you have carried out your obligations. All the commandments: You shall not commit adultery, you shall not kill, you shall not steal, you shall not covet, and so on, are summed up in this single command: You must love your neighbour as yourself. Love is the one thing that cannot hurt your neighbour; that is why it is the answer to every one of the commandments.

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

Jesus said to his disciples: 'If your brother does something wrong, go and have it out with him alone, between your two selves. If he listens to you, you have won back your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two others along with you: the evidence of two or three witnesses is required to sustain any charge. But if he refuses to listen to these, report it to the community; and if he refuses to listen to the community, treat him like a pagan or a tax collector.

'I tell you solemnly, whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.

'I tell you solemnly once again, if two of you on earth agree to ask anything at all, it will be granted to you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three meet in my name, I shall be there with them.'

SPECIAL FEAST DAY

SEPTEMBER 8: NATIVITY OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

The Church has celebrated Mary's birth since at least the sixth century. A September birth was chosen because the Eastern Church begins its Church year with September. The September 8 date helped determine the date for the feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8.

Scripture does not give an account of Mary's birth. However, the apocryphal *Protoevangelium of James* fills in the gap. This work has no historical value, but it does reflect the development of Christian piety. According to this account, Anna and Joachim are infertile but pray for a child. They receive the promise of a child who will advance God's plan of salvation for the world. Such a story, like many biblical counterparts, stresses the special presence of God in Mary's life from the beginning.

Saint Augustine connects Mary's birth with Jesus' saving work. He tells the earth to rejoice and shine forth in the light of her birth. "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley. Through her birth the nature inherited from our first parents is changed."

MOVIE REVIEW: RADIOACTIVE

"The key to any good film biography of a scientist is found in the montages that show the discovery or invention that gained the subject fame. On that score, *Radioactive* (Amazon), the story of Marie Curie (Rosamund Pike), the first woman to be awarded the Nobel Prize for physics, does not disappoint.

A sequence that begins with the crude refining of a uranium mineral called pitchblende ends with Curie smiling in bed, caressing a vial of glowing blue-green radium. It's a historical moment on the scale of Thomas Edison switching on one of his electric bulbs.

Those with at least a superficial knowledge of Curie, who died in 1934 of anaemia brought on by radiation exposure, at only age 66, will immediately know that this doesn't end well. ... The film contains scenes of violence without gore, fleeting rear female nudity in a nonsexual context, brief marital sensuality and mature themes." 
