### **A READING FROM THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES**

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoken to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to Tarsus.

The churches throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria were now left in peace, building themselves up, living in the fear of the Lord, and filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

### **A READING FROM THE FIRST LETTER OF ST JOHN**

My children,  
our love is not to be just words or mere talk,  
but something real and active;  
only this can we be certain  
that we are the children of the truth  
and be able to quieten our conscience  
in his presence,  
whatever accusations it may raise against us,  
because God is greater than our conscience  
and he knows everything.

My dear people,  
if we cannot be condemned by our own  
conscience,  
we need not be afraid in God's presence,  
and whatever we ask him,  
we shall receive,  
because we keep his commandments  
and live the kind of life that he wants.  
His commandments are these:  
that we believe in the name of his Son  
Jesus Christ.

and that we love one another  
as he told us to.

Whoever keeps his commandments  
lives in God and God lives in him  
We know that he lives in us  
by the Spirit that he has given us.

### **A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN**

Jesus said to his disciples:

'I am the true vine,  
and my Father is the vinedresser.  
Every branch in me that bears no fruit  
he cuts away,  
and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes  
to make it bear even more.

You are pruned already,  
by means of the word that I have spoken to you.  
Make your home in me, as I make mine in you.

As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself,  
but must remain part of the vine,  
neither can you unless you remain in me.

I am the vine,  
you are the branches.

Whoever remains in me, with me in him,  
bears fruit in plenty;

for cut off from me you can do nothing.

Anyone who does not remain in me  
is like a branch that has been thrown away

- he withers;

these branches are collected and thrown on the fire,  
and they are burnt.

If you remain in me,  
and my words remain in you,

you may ask what you will  
and you shall get it.

It is to the glory of my father that you should bear  
much fruit,

and then you will be my disciples.

### **COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL**

Given the importance of vineyards and grape-growing in the world of the Old Testament, it is no surprise that the image of the vine looms large as a symbol for Israel. The prophets Hosea, Isaiah, Jeremiah and Ezekiel all played with it, as does Jesus in a number of parables. Here in the Gospel of John he identifies himself as the "true vine" and his disciples as its branches.

It is an image pregnant with meaning. It has connotations of life, growth, fruitfulness and unity, plus their contraries.

Jesus' reflections do not proceed in a straight line. It may be best to think of them in terms of a spiral, as words and ideas suggest others that lead us more and more deeply into the mystery. As much as they affirm the profound union of life that the Christian community shares with Jesus, they also serve to warn of the dangers of breaking fellowship with him.

### Who are the Members of Rosary Care?

Rosary Care is an opportunity for a parishioner to be a volunteer even when busy with family and work commitments.

- 6-8 coordinators oversee the sharing out of tasks such as meals, transport, visiting, home help and parish activities.
- 30- 50 volunteers carry out the tasks having nominated the area they can manage.
- Recipients request help or are contacted after referral by a friend or neighbour who has seen a need.

**ASSISTANT TENANT ADVOCATE,  
DAYDAWN ADVOCACY CENTRE, PERTH**

Daydawn Advocacy Centre is a busy Archdiocesan agency that provides advocacy for Aboriginal people. The position is permanent part time (0.40 FTE - with a possibility of 0.60 FTE dependent on capacity requirements). This role works directly with the tenant advocate lawyer, supporting clients facing eviction and other issues related to rental properties. The work includes advice and assistance to individual tenants in person; casework and advocacy in Magistrates Court termination proceedings; advocacy to the Housing Authority for tenants and people on the housing waiting list. This role would suit someone with a commitment to social justice and tenant rights, experience in advocacy and an understanding of the *Residential Tenancies Act 1987 (WA)*.
