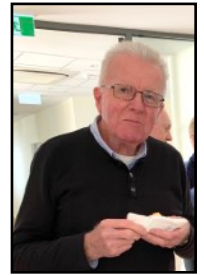
The Vinnies' pantry is looking rather empty. Please help us fill the shelves with essential food items.

## **A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MARK**

When Jesus had crossed in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered round him and he stayed by the lakeside. Then one of the synagogue officials came up, Jairus by name, and seeing him, fell at his feet and pleaded with him earnestly, saying 'My little daughter is desperately sick. Do come and lay your hands on her to make her better and save her life.' Jesus went with him and a large crowd followed him; they were pressing all round him.

Now there was a woman who had suffered from a haemorrhage for twelve years; after long and painful treatment under various doctors, she had spent all she had without being any the better for it, in fact, she was getting worse. She had heard about Jesus, and she came up behind him through the crowd and touched his cloak. 'If I can touch his clothes,' she had told herself 'I will be well again.' And the source of the bleeding dried up instantly, and she felt in herself that she was cured of her complaint. Immediately aware that power had gone out of him, Jesus turned around in the crowd and said, 'Who touched my clothes?' His disciples said to him, 'You see how the crowd is pressing round you and yet you say, "Who touched me?"' But he continued to look all round to see who had done it. Then the woman came forward, frightened and trembling because she knew what had happened to her, and she fell at his feet and told him the whole truth. 'My daughter,' he said 'your faith has restored you to health; go in peace and be free from your complaint.

While he was speaking some people arrived from the house of the synagogue official to say, 'Your daughter is dead; why put the Master to any further trouble?' But Jesus had overheard this remark of theirs and he said to the official, 'Do not be afraid; only have faith.' And he allowed no one to go with him except Peter and James and John the brother of James. So they came to the official's house and Jesus noticed all the commotion, with people weeping and wailing unrestrainedly. He went in and said to them, 'Why all this commotion and crying? The child is not dead, but asleep.' But they laughed at him. So he turned them all out and, taking with him the child's father and mother and his own companions, he went into the place where the child lay. And taking the child by the hand he said to her, 'Talitha, kumi!' which means, 'Little girl, I tell you to get up.' The little girl got up at once and began to walk about, for she was twelve years old. At this they were overcome with astonishment, and he ordered them strictly not to let anyone know about it, and told them to give her something to eat.

## **SPECIAL FEAST**

### **STS PETER & PAUL, APOSTLES - 29 JUNE**

**Sts Peter and Paul** died as martyrs at Rome under Nero, between 64-67. This pre-eminent feast day of the city of Rome has been observed on this date since the mid-third century. It commemorates the martyrdoms of Peter the 'chief of the apostles' and Paul the 'apostle to the Gentiles'. They are remembered for their faith, their courage, and their leadership during the difficult days of the birth of the Church.

### **ST THOMAS, APOSTLE - 3 JULY**

Thomas, called the Twin, was one of the twelve chosen by Jesus, and is remembered for his initial disbelief in the resurrection and his subsequent proclamation of faith upon seeing the resurrected Christ; My Lord and my God (John 20:28). An early tradition venerates him as the Apostle of India.

## **PREACHER OF GRACE**

Recently Pope Francis wrote a letter to the Dominican Order on the occasion of the eighth centenary of the death of St. Dominic. The title, or *incipit*, of his letter echoes the historic event when Pope Honorius III confirmed preaching as the mission of the Order and gave St. Dominic and his brethren in Toulouse the name "preachers". Pope Francis affirms in his letter that *preacher of grace* is a title attributed to St. Dominic that "stands out for its consonance with the charism and mission of the Order he founded. By this Pope Francis means: *the grace of preaching* and *the preaching of grace*.

The Pope was particularly expressing that the Order is expressed in all states of life in the Church – in contemplative lives, and apostolic work; in priestly and lay fraternities; in secular institutes and youth movements. All these, the Pope recognised, acknowledge different forms or "genres" of preaching: whether through writings of scholars, poets and mystics as well as artworks, works of charity and mercy. In particular Pope Francis recognised the members of the Dominican Family who have been silenced by martyrdom, as offering us an extraordinarily eloquent form of preaching.

We say that St. Dominic was "speaking either with God or about God" in a synergy of contemplation and action in preaching the Gospel. As we mark his 800<sup>th</sup> anniversary of death, his *dies natalis* – day of birth into the heavenly kingdom – we acknowledge that we are all of us co-responsible for the mission of the Church – in the many multitude of ways that is possible as missionary disciples.
