A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MARK

John said to Jesus, 'Master, we saw a man who is not one of us casting out devils in your name; and because he was not one of us we tried to stop him.' But Jesus said, 'You must not stop him: no one who works a miracle in my name is likely to speak evil of me. Anyone who is not against us is for us.

'If anyone gives you a cup of water to drink just because you belong to Christ, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.

'But anyone who is an obstacle to bring down one of these little ones who have faith, would be better thrown into the sea with a great millstone round his neck. And if your hand should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life crippled, than to have two hands and go to hell, into the fire that cannot be put out. And if your foot should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life lame, than to have two feet and be thrown into hell. And if your eye should cause you to sin, tear it out; it is better for you to enter into the Kingdom of God with one eye, than to have two eyes and be thrown into hell where their worm does not die nor their fire go out.'

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

Jesus' answer to the disciples reveals a little bit more of what this Kingdom of God is all about. And about how we, the potential citizens of this Kingdom, must behave. We must neither monopolise the right to do good, nor belittle the good others do, although they may not belong to the fold. To recognise who Jesus is – to profess ourselves as his subjects in the Kingdom of God - is to follow him, to walk with him, carrying his cross on the path which his Passover prepared. It is to lose life in order to save it. It is to be a servant to all and master to none. It is to do all that we can to include people in the Kingdom, and to do nothing deliberately to shut people out. It is to prefer nothing to the love of Christ. This is our Exodus from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the Promised Land. This is our Exodus from darkness to light. This is our exodus from death to life.

SPECIAL FEAST DAYS

September 27: SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL



Born in Gascony France in 1581, Saint Vincent was a parish priest who worked for the apostolic renewal of the clergy, founding the Congregation of the Mission (Vincentians or Lazarists) for missionary work in rural areas and

for the formation of clergy. Committed above all to the oppressed and disadvantaged, he founded the Daughters of Charity with Louise de Marillac to work with the needy. He is remembered especially for his practical concern for the poor and the sick. He died on this day in 1660.

September 29: SAINTS MICHAEL, GABRIEL & RAPHAEL, ARCHANGELS

The cult of Michael, Gabriel and Raphael began in the East. In the West, this day first marked the dedication of a fifth century church of Saint Michael in Rome. Raphael and Gabriel were added to the Roman calendar in the twentieth century and the three are now celebrated together. In the scriptures each of the three angels is named as a messenger of God, entrusted with special divine missions on earth.
