A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MARK

Some Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, 'Is it against the law for a man to divorce his wife?' They were testing him. He answered then, 'What did Moses command you?' 'Moses allowed us' they said 'to draw up a writ of dismissal and so to divorce.' Then Jesus said to them, 'It was because you were so unteachable that he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation God made them male and female. This is why a man must leave father and mother, and the two become one body. They are no longer two, therefore, but one body. So then, what God has united, man must not divide.' Back in the house the disciples questioned him again about this, and he said to them. 'The man who divorces his wife and marries another is guilty of adultery against her. And if a woman divorces her husband and marries another she is guilty of adultery too.'

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

'The Pharisees who questioned Jesus in today's Gospel Reading knew that the Jewish law of marriage stemmed from this understanding of the human person which their ancestors had. They knew that human persons were created to be in communion with each other. Therefore, marriage was seen as something sacred and permanent. Not to be discarded at the first hurdle. But the Jewish Law had allowed some exceptions to this teaching that marriage was sacred and indissoluble. But there was by no means agreement on what the exceptions to this law might be. We are told that the Pharisees asked this question to trap Jesus. And so any answer Jesus might give to this question would risk getting him off side with one party or the other. Jesus avoids their trap. He turns the question back onto his inquisitors, and asks them what Moses had taught them. Not surprisingly, the Pharisees are able to give Jesus the correct answer according to the Law of Moses: that the Law did allow a man to divorce his wife. This view stems from a time when women were considered inferior to men; indeed women were considered to be the property of men, and divorce was seen as a matter of the property rights of the man. But Jesus, in reply, gave the exact interpretation of the Book of Genesis: Man and woman are created equal. They have the same duties towards each other. In marriage, two become one body. "So then, what God has united, man must not divide." These words of Jesus could not be clearer. Marriage is sacred and indissoluble...'. Anthony Doran - Notre Dame Pastoral Liturgy

The Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary 7 October



This commemoration was established in 1573 in thanksgiving for a Christian victory over the Ottoman forces at Lepanto. It entered the general calendar in the eighteenth century. It is a memorial of the Virgin Mary as honoured in the rosary, a form of prayer combining the salutation of the angel (Luke 1:28) with meditation on the saving mysteries of Christ. Originally the rosary was the laity's "psalter", the Hail Marys replacing the 150 psalms.

Give us the courage to tell our stories and to speak boldly of your truth.

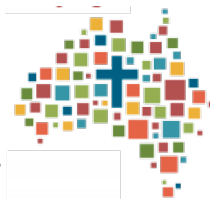
Give us ears to listen humbly to each other and a discerning heart to hear what you are saying.

SHARING THE PLENARY COUNCIL JOURNEY

People across Australia and beyond will be able to follow the progress of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia through Masses and livestream sessions when the first general assembly opens this weekend.

The Plenary Council, the first such event in Australia since 1937, will open with Mass live-streamed from St Mary's Cathedral in Perth on Sunday, October 3. Plenary Council president, Archbishop Timothy Costelloe SDB, will celebrate that Mass at 2pm AEDT and officially open the nine-month journey of the two Council assemblies.

Masses will be broadcast at 9.30am AEDT on each of the six days of the Council program, with Australian Catholic Bishops Conference president Archbishop Mark Coleridge celebrating the Mass to conclude the first assembly at 11am AEDT on Sunday, October 10.
