To align ourselves to the only authority that matters, the one that can be harder to find, but the one that we are ultimately intended to sit under and the only one that will ultimately last. #### <u>A READING FROM THE HOLY</u> <u>GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN</u>

'Are you the king of the Jews?' Pilate asked. Jesus replied, 'Do you ask this of your own accord, or have others spoken to you about me?' Pilate answered, 'Am I a Jew? It is your own people and the chief priests who have handed you over to me: what have you done?' Jesus replied, 'Mine is not a kingdom of this world; if my kingdom were of this world, my men would have fought to prevent my being surrendered to the Jews. But my kingdom is not of this kind.' 'So you are a king then?' said Pilate. 'It is you who say it' answered Jesus. 'Yes, I am a king. I was born for this. I came into the world for this: to bear witness to the truth; and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice.'

# **COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL**

The final scripture reading of the liturgical year harks back to Good Friday. It is an excerpt from John's account of the passion. Today's reading presents the first exchange between Pilate and Jesus inside the fortress. The key issue emerges: the true identity of Jesus and the nature of his kingship. As is generally the case in the dialogues of John's gospel, Jesus' conversation partner fails to grasp the true meaning of what is being said. Pilate's uncomprehending replies give Jesus the opportunity to teach even more profoundly. Today's gospel reading features a short but crucial segment of the passion narrative that may be lost in the full narrative on Good Friday.

# 24 November: SAINTS ANDREW DUNG-LAC AND COMPANIONS

Andrew was born in 1795. He was baptised at the age of fifteen, worked first as a lay missionary and then as a diocesan presbyter before being beheaded at Hanoi, Vietnam in 1839 (aged 44). He is listed among 117 canonised martyrs who died in Vietnam between 1820 an 1862 - ninety-six Vietnamese, eleven Spanish Dominicans, and ten presbyters from the Paris Foreign Mission Society. Andrew and his Companions are remembered as representatives of the thousands of Christians tortured and martyred in Vietnam between the seventeenth and nineteenth centuries: bishops, presbyters, religious, and lay people, both children and adults.
