# <u>A READING FROM THE HOLY</u> <u>GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE</u>

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowingfan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.

# COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

In an echo of the sermon on the plain, in this reading Luke is preparing us for the radical teachings of the beatitudes and the sermon that leads on from those blessings. As we await the celebration of the coming of the Good News, we are challenged by our readings and our immersion in the pandemic to ask whether we are good news to those around us. John reached beyond the usual restrictions to touch those considered beyond the bounds of God's love. As we are stretched, how well are we actually stretching to extend the bounds of God's love?

Juan de Yepes y Álvarez was born in Spain in 1541 and entered the Carmelite Order as a young man. After a meeting with St. Teresa of Avila, he joined her attempts at reforming the order and pledged himself to a more stringently monastic and studious life than Carmelites then practiced.

Arrested, imprisoned, and tortured for his beliefs by his fellow monks, John underwent a spiritual awakening while captive that led to an outpouring of mystical poetry and writing, later collected in volumes such as *Ascent of Mount Carmel, Dark Night of the Soul,* and *A Spiritual Canticle of the Soul and the Bridegroom Christ.* He died in 1591 and was canonised a saint in 1726.

St. John of the Cross is considered one of Spanish literature's most important poets, and his works have been translated many times since his death. In the 20th century, poets John Frederick Nims and Willis Barnstone translated the poetry of St. John of the Cross into English.

- Has the Parish played a role in any major life milestones as an individual, couple or family?
- What do you remember about the priests, brothers and sisters who have been involved in the Parish over the years?
- What was the local area like in the 1960s 1990s?
