A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE

Jesus began to speak in the synagogue, 'This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.' And he won the approval of all, and they were astonished by the gracious words that came from his lips.

They said, 'This is Joseph's son surely?' But he replied, 'No doubt you will quote me the saying "Physician, heal yourself" and tell me, "We have heard all that happened in Capernaum, do the same here in your own countryside."'And he went on, 'I tell you solemnly, no prophet is ever accepted in his own country.

'There were many widows in Israel, I can assure you, in Elijah's day, when heaven remained shut for three years and six months and a great famine raged throughout the land, but Elijah was not sent to any one of these: he was sent to the widow at Zarephath, a Sidonian town. And in the prophet Elisha's time there were many lepers in Israel, but none of these was cured, except the Syrian, Naaman.'

When they heard this everyone in the synagogue was enraged. They sprang to their feet and hustled him out of the town; and they took him up to the brow of the hill their town was built on, intending to throw him down the cliff, but he slipped through the crowd and walked away.

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

The final sentence of last Sunday's gospel serves as the stepping stone into part two of the story. In his home-town synagogue Jesus has read out a messianic text from the prophet Isaiah. Now he declares it fulfilled. The community reacts at first with enthusiasm but in the blink of an eye this appreciation is poisoned by doubt then worsens to the lethal antagonism from which Jesus withdraws. As the evangelist John would have put it, Jesus' hour had not yet come, and he slips away.

Being the great story-teller that he is, Luke weaves word, feeling and action together to create a thrilling drama. As he did in his infancy narrative, he takes a very human situation and gives it theological depth.

SPECIAL FEAST

February 2: THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord dates back at least to the late 4th century. We know this from the diary of the Spanish pilgrim Egeria who was visiting Jerusalem then and keeping a record of the liturgies she witnessed. The feast commemorates Mary and Joseph's visit to the Temple to present the infant Jesus to the Lord, an event described only in the gospel of Luke. In accordance with Jewish law, this was forty days after his birth. That visit prompts prophetic utterances from the devout elders Simeon and Anna.

FILM REVIEW

Nitram, a film based on the events leading up to the Port Arthur tragedy, has won the 2021 International Catholic Organisation for Cinema Australia award. Source: Australian Catholics.

Directed by Justin Kurzel, the film recounts how Martin ('Nitram' spelt backwards) increasingly became a troubled and isolated young man, and who gunned down and killed 35 people at Port Arthur in Tasmania.

The film is a dramatic adaptation of tragic events. It is not a particularly violent or sensational film, and the movie never refers to the killer's full name. It is respectful of the dignity of the victims, and does not show the details of the massacre itself, but chooses instead to concentrate on the isolation, reclusiveness. and growing pathology of Martin as his anger and frustration explode to a tragic end.

The film masterly builds tension as the tragedy of the impending massacre looms large. Appealing to Martin's bullied and friendless history, it offers an insightful understanding of his odd behaviour, while not giving any endorsement of his criminal actions, and it reveals the gravity of his mental illness, without dwelling on horrific events.

The OCIC award for an Australian film was instituted in 1979. In choosing the winner, the OCIC looks for a film of high artistic quality that dramatises positive human values among other criteria.
