A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. At daybreak he appeared in the Temple again; and as all the people came to him, he sat down and began to teach them. The scribes and Pharisees brought a woman along who had been caught committing adultery; and making her stand there in full view of everybody, they said to Jesus, 'Master, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery, and Moses has ordered us in the Law to condemn women like this to death by stoning. What have you to say?' They asked him this as a test, looking for something to use against him. But Jesus bent down and started writing on the ground with his finger. As they persisted with their question, he looked up and said, 'If there is one of you who has not sinned, let him be the first to throw a stone at her.' Then he bent down and wrote on the ground again.

When they heard this they went away one by one, beginning with the eldest, until Jesus was left alone with the woman, who remained standing there. He looked up and said, 'Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?' 'No one, sir,' she replied. 'Neither do I condemn you,' said Jesus, 'go away, and don't sin any more.'

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

A woman humiliated in public, an absent accomplice, authorities baying for blood, and an unarmed defender. These are the characters in today's gospel story. Also in play are judgement, sexism, anger and self-righteousness, all ultimately undone by mercy, wisdom and compassion.

The story assumes the truth of the allegation, but the authorities' appeal to the Law is partial. In the case of adultery, both parties were to be put to death by those who witnessed the offence. This makes the action of the authorities in using the never-named woman as bait, the reference to "women like this," and the absence of her fellow adulterer all the more reprehensible.

Jesus neither excuses nor blames her. He simply refuses to condemn her. His very posture - bending to the ground while she stood, looking up to her rather than down on her - suggests an intentional mark of respect, restoring her dignity. The simplicity of the story belies its powerful appeal.

PASTORAL WORKER

(Permanent, Full Time)

The Aboriginal Catholic Ministry of the Archdiocese of Perth is seeking to appoint a full time, permanent Pastoral Worker. The successful applicant will have a strong awareness of Aboriginal culture, knowledge and understanding the effects of isolation, illness, death, and being “off country” for Aboriginal people and knowledge and understanding of human rights issues that impact on the lives of Aboriginal people. The position requires a person with strong communication and time management skills, who is friendly, helpful and courteous manner when dealing with people. General office skills to support the position including basic computer skills are also required. A requirement of the position is a qualification in Clinical Pastoral Education or equivalent (or willingness to complete study for the qualification). You will be required to have a current Police Clearance, WWC Check, Driver’s License (LR Class license desirable) and a COVID-19 Vaccination Certificate.
