# OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

The Palm Procession will leave from the *Rosary Garden* at 9:45am into the Church for 10:00am Mass.

Every year on this Sunday the story of Jesus' betrayal, passion and death is told at length. The reading is taken in turn from one of the synoptic gospels - Matthew, Mark or Luke - because we always read John's account on Good Friday. This year we read from Luke.

In common with the other evangelists, Luke wishes to show that the suffering and death of the Messiah was something that 'had' to happen according to the plan of God announced in the Scriptures.

## The Paschal Triduum



The evening Mass of the Lord's Supper gets the Paschal Triduum under way. The liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil are three parts of a single whole.

Tonight's liturgy takes the familiar form of a Eucharist, but also includes the transfer of the Sacrament for Good Friday Holy Communion. The transfer offers us an invitation to prepare prayerfully for the next day's service.

There is no dismissal tonight.



The liturgy of Good Friday is both solemn and simple. The shape of the service is clear. It has three distinct components: Liturgy of the Word (with readings, homily and prayers), Adoration of the Holy Cross, and Holy Communion.

The solemnity of the celebration is reinforced by the silence with which it is surrounded.

On no other occasion in the liturgical year does a service begin and end in silence, without greeting or dismissal.


For all its solemnity, the Good Friday liturgy is not sad or mournful. On the contrary, what is being celebrated is the triumph of the cross.



Fire, light, water and oil, bread and wine, a common table – these are the elemental symbols which thrill our hearts on this night of nights, the Easter Vigil.

"This is the night, when Christ broke the prison-bars of death and rose victorious from the underworld"

This is the night of life, of light, of love. This is the night on which light blazes in the darkness, the night on which we wait and watch and listen, the night we bathe in the waters of life, the night we break bread at table with the risen Lord.

"Let us also remember that health care is not just an organisation; it depends on men and women who dedicate their life to taking care of other people's health," the Pope said in video appeal issued yesterday.

In the Pope Video for April, Francis said the COVID-19 pandemic has "shown us the self-giving and generosity of health care workers, volunteers, support staff, priests, and religious men and women".

Health care workers who "have given their lives during this pandemic to help so many sick people recover", he added.

The Pope Video is promoted by the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network, which raises awareness of monthly papal prayer intentions. Pope Francis' prayer intention for April reads: "Let us pray for health care workers who serve the sick and the elderly, especially in the poorest countries; may they be adequately supported by governments and local
