Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

What do you think? Is saying a prayer to God like firing off a rocket into space and hoping that it will reach its target? Or is it true, as St Augustine once said, that God is closer to us than we are to ourselves? According to Jesus in today's gospel, if we love him, we will keep his words in our heart and mind, and the Father and Jesus will make their home with us. And if the Father and Jesus love us enough to make their home with us, it must give them pleasure to hear and answer our prayers.

When Jesus says he will make his home with us, he is thinking back to the time when his Jewish ancestors lived in tents in the desert, and God was present with them in the special Tent of Meeting. In other words, Jesus is telling us that he will pitch his tent, the place where he lives with the Father, next door to us.

Or even better, that Jesus regards us as the tent where he will come to live, since he also talks about living within us. Jesus wants to dwell within the deepest part of us, where our entire conscious life has its origin, and transform us into his image.

Or yet again our dominant image can be that of Jesus coming to share our tent. And what is it that tent dwellers do to express and deepen their caring relationships with each other? They share a feast. And so Jesus created a sacred meal for us and invites us to share – the bread and wine of his body and blood.
