## THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

This feast, originally Corpus Christi, arose in thirteenth century Belgium in response to debates about the Real Presence and as a result of an upsurge in eucharistic piety. Its extension to the entire Western Church was first decreed by Urban IV in 1264. The feast celebrates the mystery of the nourishing and enduring presence of the body and blood of Christ in the Eucharist.

**A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL**  
**ACCORDING TO LUKE**

Jesus made the crowds welcome and talked to them about the kingdom of God; and he cured those who were in need of healing.

It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, 'Send the people away, and they can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.' He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people.' For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.' They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets.

**FEAST OF THE MOST HOLY BODY**  
**AND BLOOD OF CHRIST**

*Dear Parishioners and Visitors,*

*When you were very young did your father ever give you some money to buy a present for your mother for her birthday? Or maybe your mother gave you some money to buy a birthday present for your father. That is what happened in my family, and I suspect it was a fairly common practice in the 1940's. I think this can help us understand what the Eucharist is all about , which is what we are celebrating today.*

*We enjoy giving presents to those we love. The Scriptures make it clear that God likes giving us things —human life to begin with, then a share in the divine life leading us to eternal happiness, and everything in-between. But what can we possibly give God in return? The answer can only be something he has already given us.*

*At Mass Jesus, God's Son, becomes present to us as the Body of Christ. We have been members of that Body since our baptism. So it is **our** Body. As such, we are one with Christ's offering of Himself to the Father , which is what becomes present for us at Mass. He is the gift we offer to God the Father, and we become part of that self-offering Jesus made to the Father on Calvary.*

*Today's feast of the Eucharist is our feast as well. The Body and Blood of Christ has been given to us, and we belong to it, and are part of it. And so we celebrate it at Mass*

**SPECIAL FEASTS**

**24 June: THE MOST SACRED HEART  
OF JESUS**

This devotion, which dates back to the Middle Ages, flowered in France in the seventeenth century as a result of the visions of Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque. The feast was extended to the entire Western Church by Pius IX in 1856. It recalls the mystery of God who is love, and honours the heart of Jesus as the source and centre of the incarnate love of God.

**25 June: THE NATIVITY OF JOHN  
THE BAPTIST**

John the Baptist spent his adult life preparing the way for Jesus, and proclaiming that "*the Kingdom of Heaven is close at hand.*" He was born to Zachary and Elizabeth, an elderly married couple. The Angel Gabriel had visited Zachary and told him that his wife would bear a child, even though she was already past the child-bearing age.

Elizabeth was Mary's cousin and Zachary was a priest of the Temple in Jerusalem. As a baby in the womb, John recognized Jesus' presence in Mary's womb when Mary visited Elizabeth soon after the Annunciation.

John was probably born at Ain-Karim, which is southwest of Jerusalem. As a young adult, he lived as a hermit in the desert of Judea until about A.D. 27. When he was 30, he began to preach on the banks of the Jordan, calling for repentance and baptising people in the river waters. When Jesus came to John to be baptised, John recognised Him as the Messiah and baptised Him, saying: "It is I who need baptism from you."

John continued to preach after Jesus was baptised, but was imprisoned not long after by Herod Antipas, after he denounced the king's adulterous marriage with Herodias, wife of his half-brother Philip.

John was beheaded at the request of Salome, daughter of Herodias. Many came to know Jesus through John, namely the Apostles Andrew and John.
