## A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE

There was a lawyer who, to disconcert Jesus, stood up and said to him, 'Master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' He said to him, 'What is written in the law? What do you read there?' He replied, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbour as yourself.' 'You have answered right,' said Jesus. 'Do this and life is yours.'

But the man was anxious to justify himself and said to Jesus, 'And who is my neighbour?' Jesus replied, 'A man was once on his way down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of brigands; they took all he had, beat him and then made off, leaving him half dead. Now a priest happened to be traveling down the same road, but when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. In the same way a Levite who came to the place saw him, and passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan traveller who came upon him was moved with compassion when he saw him. He went up and bandaged his wounds, pouring oil and wine on them. He then lifted him on to his own mount, carried him to the inn and looked after him. Next day, he took out two denarii and handed them to the innkeeper, "Look after this," he said "and on my way back I will make good any extra expense you have." Which of these three, do you think, proved himself a neighbour to the man who fell into the brigand's hands?' 'The one who took pity on him' he replied. Jesus said to him, 'Go, and do the same yourself.'

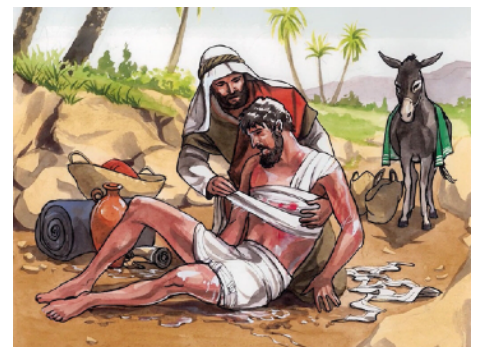
*Dear Parishioners and Visitors,*

*Do you ever wonder about how to get to know God better? According to Pope Francis, God's principal name or characteristic is mercy or compassion. So it follows that to see someone being compassionate or showing mercy is to be seeing a reflection of God, since God is the source of all compassion and mercy. Likewise, when we notice ourselves doing something compassionate for someone, it is helpful to realise that we are being at least a little bit godlike, we are allowing God to show himself through us.*

*In today's gospel it was their faulty understanding of God and his law that led the priest and the Levite to leave the robbed and beaten up man in the ditch, instead of coming to his help like the Samaritan. The law forbade priests and Levites to minister in the temple after contact with the dead, and the man in the ditch looked to them as though he could be dead.*

*Jesus came among us to reinterpret God's Law by making love of God and love of neighbour, compassion, one supreme law. Jesus is being loved by anyone who loves or has compassion for their neighbour. It is worth noticing that in this way the "Law" becomes good news: we like it when others offer us genuine compassion in our times of need, and our own compassion becomes the way into eternal life. Moreover, compassion makes us Godlike!*
