WORLD DAY OF GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY

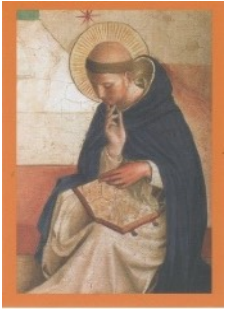
The elderly must not be forgotten, the pastoral care of the elderly is a priority that can no longer be postponed by any Christian community.

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples' He said to them 'Say this when you pray:

"Father, may your name be held holy,
your kingdom come;
give us each day our daily bread,
and forgive us our sins,
for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us.
and do not put us to the test."

He also said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say, "My friend, lend me three loaves because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and the man answers from inside the house, "Do not bother me. The door is bolted now, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you." I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it to him for friendship's sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants.

'So I say to you: Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him. What father among you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? Or hand him a snake instead of a fish? Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

With some prayers, which we say every day of our lives, it is easy to rattle them off without much thought. That is true of the Our Father in particular. But it is a pity, because the Our Father has layers of meaning which we can keep penetrating a little more deeply each time we say it.

Jesus taught his disciples the Our Father to give them an image of what God is like, and what, as a result, their attitude towards God ought to be. This is something we can only grow towards as we get older and hopefully wiser. As Christians, Jesus is telling us, we come to God as a member of his beloved family, as a brother or sister of his Son, Jesus. As children who are dependent on their Father, we turn to him confidently, trustingly, to receive everything that we need and that he therefore wants us to have. That is what The Our Father is all about.

But doesn't it seem to take a lifetime to really absorb that message and live it? Don't we sometimes notice ourselves imagining God as less loving and understanding than our best friends? And so, after teaching his disciples the Our Father, Jesus tells the story of the man who was unwilling to get out of bed to help his neighbour look after a visitor. It was only the fear of shame before everyone living in the same street that finally made him come to the help of his neighbour. And so, Jesus is asking us, do we really think our Father God is less willing to help us than the mean old man in the story was to get up and find some food for his neighbour?

SPECIAL FEAST: SAINTS JOACHIM AND ANNE - 26 JULY

Joachim and Anne are named as Mary's parents in a late second century tradition. Churches dedicated to Saint Anne are found in Jerusalem and Constantinople from the middle of the sixth century - the Feast of Saint Joachim from the fifteenth century. The feast honours the parents of the Virgin Mary and grandparents of the Lord.
