Safeguarding Induction for All Church Workers

The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference has broadened safeguarding to include adults at risk. **ALL church workers** (volunteers or paid) are to attend a 2-hour safeguarding induction. A church worker is **anyone** in the parish in **any** role – paid or voluntary.

This induction provides an overview of the Safeguarding Policies and Procedures, the role of the Parish Safeguarding Officer, and the importance of Safeguarding within the parish. You can complete the induction online on these dates: Tuesday, 13 September at 7 pm • Wednesday, 28 September at 10 am.

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at this table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.


Dear Parishioners and Visitors.

At the end of Mass today, like every other day, the priest is told to bless the community present and send them back out into the world: "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord," or words to that effect. At Mass we have hopefully listened to God's Word and been strengthened to live it by our receiving of Christ's Body and Blood. That means announcing it by our lives.

So how are we going to announce the Gospel by our lives? Let me suggest one way which comes straight from the Gospel. The children among us are probably the most obvious example of people who are dependent. They need their family and others to care for them. As such, they remind us that in fact we are all totally dependent on a loving God. There is nothing we have or can do that does not come from the creative and loving act of God within us. That is why Jesus said that we all have to become like little children: we have to learn again to accept that everything we have and achieve is gift.

And that sheds light on today's gospel. It helps us to see how absurd it is to be thinking that we deserve the best places at the banquet, or anywhere else, when everything we have or are that is of value, is a free gift from God.
