A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE

Great crowds accompanied Jesus on his way and he turned and spoke to them. 'If any man comes to me without hating his father, mother, wife, children, brothers, sisters, yes, and his own life too, he cannot be my disciple. Anyone who does not carry his cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.

'And indeed, which of you here, intending to build a tower, would not first sit down and work out the cost to see if he had enough to complete it? Otherwise, if he laid the foundation and then found himself unable to finish the work, the onlookers would all start making fun of him and saying, "Here is a man who started to build and was unable to finish." Or again what king marching to war against another king would not first sit down and consider whether with ten thousand men he could stand up to the other who advanced against him with twenty thousand? If not, then while the other king was still a long way off, he would send envoys to sue for peace. So in the same way, none of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions.'

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,


Jesus seems very demanding in today's gospel. He tells us we have to prefer (to hate is simply a way of emphasising this) God to all other relationships and to all our possessions, and we have to take our place following Christ in his Passion. There is nothing new in all this. Every good human life is a way of the Cross, we only have to look at the lives of the saints, including those still around us, to see this, and every one of us has our own unique crosses to carry.

But this is not the whole picture of our lives. Immediately before today's Gospel passage Jesus has compared his Father's Kingdom, to which we are all invited, to a marvellous wedding feast where there is nothing but celebration. Many of those invited do not want to come because they are too wrapped up in the immediate enjoyment of life. They cannot think beyond the present moment.

So it is not all doom and gloom for those who decide to forego some of the pleasures of the present moment and accept the invitation to travel to the banquet. They already experience the satisfaction of knowing that their company is valued and that God wants to share his banquet with them. Already they have the joy of being able to look forward to something wonderful.

The bottom line of today's Gospel, and one of the important points Luke wants to bring home to us, is the reason why it is the poor, the crippled, the lame, and those who live on the roads and in lanes who end up in God's kingdom. It is because they have no earthly attachments to distract them from what really matters. They have already recognised the emptiness within them that only God has the capacity to fill. That is a good reason why we keep coming back to the Eucharist.
