SPECIAL FEAST

September 27: SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL

Born in Gascony France in 1581, Saint Vincent was a parish priest who worked for

the apostolic renewal of the clergy, founding the Congregation of the Mission (Vincentians or Lazarists) for missionary work in rural areas and for the formation of clergy. Committed above all to the oppressed and disadvantaged, he founded the Daughters of Charity with Louise de Marillac to work with the needy. He is remembered especially for his practical concern for the poor and the sick. He died on this day in 1660.

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE

Jesus said to the Pharisees; 'There was a rich man who used to dress in purple and fine linen and feast magnificently every day. And at his gate there lay a poor man called Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to fill himself with the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even came and licked his sores. Now the poor man died and was carried away by the angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried.

'In his torment in Hades he looked up and saw Abraham a long way off with Lazarus in his bosom. So he cried out, "Father Abraham, pity me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in agony in these flames." "My son," Abraham replied, "remember that during your life good things came your way, just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony. But that is not all: between us and you a great gulf has been fixed, to stop anyone, if he wanted to, crossing from our side to yours, and to stop any crossing from your side to ours."

'The rich man replied, "Father, I beg you then to send Lazarus to my father's house, since I have five brothers, to give them warning so that they do not come to this place of torment too." "They have Moses and the prophets," said Abraham, "let them listen to them" "Ah, no, father Abraham," said the rich man "but if someone comes to them from the dead, they will repent." Then Abraham said to him, "If they will not listen either to Moses or to the prophets, they will not be convinced even someone should rise from the dead."

Dear Parishioners and Visitors.

St Luke is showing us in today's gospel that he was worried about the salvation of all the rich people he had in his community.

And it is worth noticing that the rich man in the story is not portrayed as particularly wicked. What destroys him is his failure to even notice the poor man Lazarus at his gate.



One possible way of trying to absorb the message is to ask ourselves, "Who is the poor person at my gate?" They might not be hungry, naked, without shelter or covered in sores. But the essential thing is that they are **in need.**

Maybe, in the light of the gospel, we can say that just as Lazarus was in fact intended as the rich man's way to God – a way which he completely missed – so our own Lazarus is our way to God. In the light of the Gospel again, doesn't it make sense to say that our own Lazarus, whatever their name, is Jesus, our way to God.

Is this all "good news"? Yes, because it gives us a way to come closer to Jesus who identifies with the needy, and because it offers us an assurance of salvation.
