

PARISH AGM CAPS BUSY YEAR

The contributions of scores of people and groups were applauded by the main speakers at this year's annual general meeting of the parish held on Sunday 23 October.

The well-attended AGM heard parish priest Fr Peter cite an amazingly long list of contributors to what he likes to refer to as the "Our Lady of the Rosary family".

While thanking so many, he also invited feedback from parishioners on "how we can do better".

Pastoral Associate Elle Aurora summarised the outcomes of the year's sacramental program and the significant progress made on broadening our safeguarding regime. Elle highlighted examples of acts of charity extended to people enduring loss and hardships.

Parish Council chair Helen Murray reviewed a list of milestone events conducted during the year and the activation of a parish Facebook page. Helen expressed a hope that the children's liturgy program could be revived.

She also flagged the development of a strategic pastoral plan emerging from recent strong survey results and heralded a celebration in May next year to mark the 50th anniversary of the opening of our church building.

Finance Committee chair John Mordini reported a net surplus exceeding \$30,000 for the parish which he described as an excellent result in the face of an economic decline.

John said a generous \$100,000 bequest enabled the parish to reduce its loan to the Dominican Fathers to under \$380,000, helping restrain the growth in our forthcoming interest payments which are inflation-linked.

The AGM was held a month earlier this year due to Fr Peter's annual leave schedule.

The meeting agreed to publish account details for the foundation (which maintains the church) to assist contributions and to promote awareness of our memorial wall and garden commemorating deceased parishioners.



A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE

Jesus entered Jericho and was going through the town when a man whose name was Zacchaeus made his appearance; he was one of the senior tax collectors and a wealthy man. He was anxious to see what kind of man Jesus was, but he was too short and could not see him for the crowd; so he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree to catch a glimpse of Jesus who was to pass that way. When Jesus reached the spot he looked up and spoke to him: 'Zacchaeus, come down. Hurry, because I must stay at your house today.' And he hurried down and welcomed him joyfully. They all complained when they saw what was happening. 'He has gone to stay at a sinner's house' they said. But Zacchaeus stood his ground and said to the Lord, 'Look sir, I am going to give half my property to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody I will pay him back four times the amount.' And Jesus said to him 'Today salvation has come to this house, because this man too is a son of Abraham; for the Son of Man has come to seek out and save what was lost.

Dear Parishioners & Visitors,

The story of the wealthy and influential but unpopular tax collector, Zacchaeus, must be one of the best known stories in the gospels. He climbs a tree to see Jesus over the heads of the crowd, and Jesus singles him out as someone special he wants to visit.

Perhaps the most important point Luke is making in telling us this story is about the kind of Church Jesus came to establish.

Zacchaeus was looked upon in the town as a sinner and someone to be avoided. But Jesus singles him out and calls him into his community of followers – his Church.

People complained. But Jesus knew that his Father wanted him to seek out the lost. And Jesus today commissions us through baptism to continue that project, even if it makes some people complain.

In somewhat the same way the elder brother of the prodigal son complained about the welcome his father gave to his prodigal son on his return from squandering his fortune. In another story, when Simon the Pharisee invited Jesus to a meal in his home, he complained when Jesus accepted the kisses and anointing of a sinful woman who knelt at his feet.

Our calling as Church is not to condemn people, but like Jesus, to help them to see their true selves as loved by God and called to love in return.
