A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

Jesus said to his disciples:

'I tell you, if your virtue goes no deeper than that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never get into the kingdom of heaven.

'You have learnt how it was said to our ancestors: You must not kill; and if anyone does kill he must answer for it before the court. But I say this to you: anyone who is angry with his brother will answer for it before the court.

'You have learnt how it was said: You must not commit adultery. But I say this to you: if a man looks at a woman lustfully, he has already committed adultery with her in his heart.

'Again, you have learnt how it was said to our ancestors: You must not break your oath, but must fulfil your oaths to the Lord. But I say this to you: do not swear at all. All you need say is "Yes" if you mean yes, "No" if you mean no; anything more than this comes from the evil one.

Dear Parishioners & Visitors,

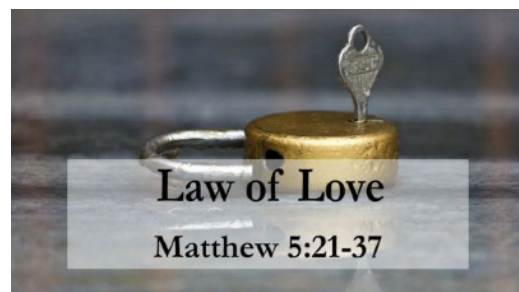
Did Jesus come into our world in order to make new demands on us? A first glimpse at today's gospel might seem like that: "But I say to you ...". A closer look, however, will show that making greater demands on us is not what Jesus was all about.

Jesus came to share his life with us. He invites us to believe that through faith in him we stop being just human beings. We now share his divine nature as adopted daughters and sons of God. St. Paul calls us members of Jesus' body on earth.

So it is now 'natural' for us to live and act in a godlike way. That means we are now capable of giving first place to love, compassion, generosity and trust in dealing with our fellow human beings. That is being 'perfect' as Jesus requires of us, and shows that we truly are 'images of God', as we were created to be.

We are meant to be caught up in Jesus' vision or way of seeing people and things. Then we will actually want to carry out what he requires of us.
