## REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

### **First Reading: Leviticus 19:1-2, 17-18**

*'The text from Leviticus prefigures the teachings of Jesus – how we treat our brothers and sisters is fundamental to the whole Law'*

*'Today's Psalm is a reminder that the foundation of loving others rests first in God's constant mercy shown toward us.'*

### **Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 3:16-23**

*'The repeated theme that we have heard from Corinthians in recent weeks continues; God's wisdom far supersedes human wisdom. This week, Paul focusses on how we are called to unity in such wisdom. Being a family that belongs to Christ is the only source of self-importance that matters.'*

### **Gospel Reading: Matthew 5:38-48**

*'The first chapter of the Sermon on the Mount finishes with a call to a life mirroring the perfection of God.'*

## A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You have learnt how it was said: Eye for eye and tooth for tooth. But I say this to you: offer the wicked man no resistance. On the contrary, if anyone hits you on the right cheek, offer him the other as well; if a man takes you to law and would have your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone orders you to go one mile, go two miles with him. Give to anyone who asks, and if anyone wants to borrow, do not turn away.'

'You have learnt how it was said: You must love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you; in this way you will be sons of your Father in heaven, for he causes his sun to rise on bad men as well as good, and his rain to fall on honest and dishonest men alike. Or if you love those who love you, what right have you to claim any credit? Even the tax collectors do as much, do they not? And if you save your greetings for your brothers, are you doing anything exceptional? Even the pagans do as much, do they not? You must therefore be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect.'

## REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

Dear Parishioners and Visitors

At least occasionally, I suspect, most of us have to cope with the conviction that God is asking something of us which will not be easy. Being nice to people who have offended us, for example, can be a challenge. God does make demands on us. But the gospel today reminds us that he never abandons us to our own resources to cope with those demands.

In the first place Jesus tells us that God is our Father. Jesus' demand for us to become perfect like God reminds that it is natural for children to become like their parents. And God, like any good parent, is always there to offer support.

Ultimately, it is only God who can make us like himself – so we need to have faith and trust in him, and allow him to do as he wishes with us. By sharing in our Mass today we are saying to God that we do want to become more lively members of the Body of Christ, following behind him like Peter.
