LENTEN REFLECTION

Last Tuesday night 7 March, Fr Greg Donovan led a group of parishioners on a special journey through the Lenten Sunday gospels. He shared a number of meaningful messages:

- Lent is a time for us to commune with God, as Jesus did for 40 days in the desert.
- The eye can't look at itself – it is designed to bring the outside in so we can see the mercy, grace, suffering and needs of the world
- Lent is not so much about what we give up but is more about what we take on. We are called to be people of hope and turn with the Lord to enter into a relationship with God.

Fr Greg left us with a Mystery to think about through Lent – who is God for us in our lives?

REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

First Reading: Exodus 17:3-7

'In the midst of their desert sojourn, the thirsty Israelites begin to doubt God's goodness. To allay both their thirst and their doubt, through the ministry of Moses, God provides water for the people to drink.'

Responsorial Psalm:

If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

'Today's responsorial psalm alludes to the episode we read in the first reading. We are called to enter and praise God, the rock who saves us, not to harden our hearts as our forebears once did in the desert.'

Second Reading: Romans 5:1-2, 5-8

'Today's second reading is another reflection by Paul on the many gifts now given to us through Jesus Christ our Lord. Here, Paul uses the beautiful image of God's love poured into our hearts.'

Gospel Reading: John 4:5-42

'This Sunday we read the story of the woman at the well: a story of so much more than water to drink, but a story of the One who wishes to encounter us and give us to drink the water of eternal life.'

REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

We can often see dogs on a lead trying to stay still while their owner wants to pull them away to continue their journey. I think something like that sometimes happens between God and us. God is trying to move us in a new direction, but we are resisting. That is basically what sin is – resisting God.

The Samaritan woman in the gospel is doing the same thing. Jesus is trying to bring her to a deeper understanding of who he is and what he has to offer her as the Messiah - a new life of intimacy with God. But she keeps distracting him with new questions. Jesus persists and eventually she becomes an apostle in seeking out her neighbours to come and meet Jesus.



I think the main point St. John is making in today's passage of his gospel is that only personal contact with Jesus will bring us to a deeper faith and a better life. Jesus invites the Samaritan woman into a conversation with him. She ends up becoming a new kind of person, and brings the other villagers along with her.

We are invited into such personal contact with Jesus every time we hear the Gospel read to us at Mass. That is what we are celebrating with the priest and each other.
