SON OF DUBLIN MAKES HIS MARK

Bonaventure Leahy, born the son of a butcher near Dublin in 1920, grew up to become a gifted amateur architect and Dominican friar. His hometown of Clondalkin

was dominated by an eighth century round tower which was to prove influential in the young man's life work. With two years of building studies behind him, Fr Leahy was sent to Australia



in 1949 to help erect churches and schools for the Dominicans. These projects took him to Adelaide, Melbourne, Canberra, Auckland and eventually Perth.

It was in WA that his mission reached its zenith with the creation of our magnificent church in Doubleview.

On 13-14 May this year we will celebrate the 50th anniversary of Fr Leahy's achievements with a special Mass, morning tea and launch of a specially-commissioned book on the building and the dedicated Irishman behind it.

The Annunciation of the Lord



The Feast of the Annunciation is celebrated on March 25 every year in the Roman Catholic Church, except when the day falls during the Easter Triduum – Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday – in which case the feast is transferred to the most suitable day during Easterside.

The Feast of the Annunciation celebrates God's entrance into the human world through Jesus, and Mary's willingness to accept God's command.

REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

First Reading:

1 Samuel 16:1b, 6-7, 10-13a

'Our first reading tells the story of the choice of David and his anointing. We learn that things are not always as they appear. The smallest and the least, so often rejected by the world, are almost always the ones chosen to fulfil God's plan of salvation.'

Responsorial Psalm:

The Lord is my shepherd, there is nothing I shall want.

'This most famous of all the psalms reminds us that, with God as our shepherd, we are rested and renewed, banqueted and anointed. God's care for us is all that we will ever need.'

Second Reading: Ephesians 5:8-14

'The contrast between life in darkness and our new life in Christ, a life lived in the light, is highlighted by today's second reading.'

Gospel Reading: John 9:1-41

'The healing of the man-born-blind highlights the journey of faith of those believe – the man-born-blind moves towards the 'sight' of faith, while those opposed to Jesus move further into sightless, spiritual darkness.'

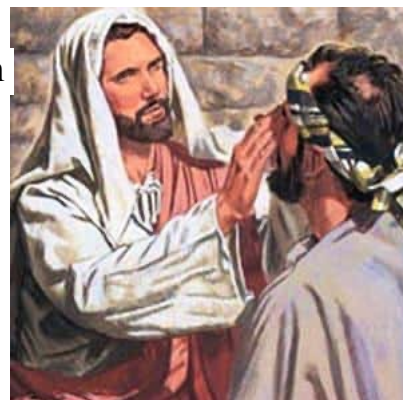
REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Today we are meant to imagine ourselves outside the Temple in Jerusalem at night. On the highest spots of the Temple large fires have been lit, which can be seen from miles away. It is the feast of Tabernacles, the celebration of thanksgiving for the recent harvest. In this setting Jesus proclaims himself to be the Light of the World, replacing the Temple as the place where God lives among his people.

In the gospel today St. John is presenting us with two journeys taking place, that of the blind man who moves from physical blindness into the light of Christ, while the religious authorities move from physical sight into the darkness of unbelief. They are like two cable cars travelling on the same tracks in opposite directions, and therefore bound to clash.

The gift of physical sight of the blind man illustrates what God is doing for humanity through Jesus – drawing us out of the darkness of sin to his Son, the Light of the World.



The blind man's journey from physical blindness to physical sight symbolises a deeper journey from unbelief to a deep faith, from knowing only "the man called Jesus" to knowing him as Son of Man and Lord. How deep is our faith is the question that remains for us?
