## INSPIRATION FROM THE MID-WEST

Monsignor John Hawes is known as the pioneering designer and builder of Geraldton's cathedral and a string of stone churches throughout the Gascoyne and Mid-West regions of WA during the 1920s and 30s.



When Fr Bonaventure Leahy OP came to Doubleview to plan the architecture and construction of our church in the late 1960s, he knew nothing of the WA environment, conditions or building materials so as part of his research he travelled north to inspect Hawes' structures.

This exercise proved inspirational to him.

On 13-14 May this year we will celebrate the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Fr Leahy's achievements with a special Mass, morning tea and launch of a specially-commissioned book on the building and the dedicated Irishman behind it.

## REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

### **First Reading: Ezekiel 37:12-14**

*In this vision of Ezekiel, we learn that God brings life out of death. With God's spirit breathed into us once more, we are brought home to our own place.*

### **Responsorial Psalm:**

With the Lord there is mercy, and fullness of redemption.

### **Second Reading: Romans 8:8-11**

*Today's Second Reading is a Pauline reflection on where life is to be found. Life is to be found, not in the Law, but in the Spirit. While sin brings death, the Spirit of God living in us brings life to us.*

### **Gospel Reading: John 11:1-45**

*John presents the raising of Lazarus as the last of the 'signs' given by Jesus and indeed the defining act of his public ministry. This Gospel reading reminds us that the story of Lazarus, the story of Jesus, our story ends never in death, but in God's glory.*

## REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

To live with a loving faith in Jesus gives us a share here and now in the eternal life of God. We call that grace. This was the whole point of the Father sending Jesus to live among us, to offer us that gift. Restoring Lazarus to physical human life was a symbol of the eternal life that Jesus came to give to all of us.

Lazarus stands in for all of us. We are all 'Lazarus' - friends of Jesus, "the one whom he loved."

His leaving the safety of Galilee to go to Bethany to raise Lazarus was a symbol of his leaving the 'safety' of his eternal existence with the Father in order to rescue us and share with us his divine life.

It was Jesus' love for his friend Lazarus that urged him to raise Lazarus from the dead, even though he knew that this would cost him his life at the hands of his enemies. This reminds us of the cost to Jesus of his saving death for all of us.
