PALM SUNDAY

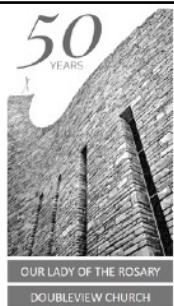
OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

Every year on this Sunday the story of Jesus' betrayal, passion and death is told at length. The reading is taken in turn from one of the synoptic gospels - Matthew, Mark or Luke - because we always read John's account on Good Friday. This year we read from Matthew.

SAVE THE DATE

The Parish will be celebrating an important milestone this year – the **50th anniversary** of the blessing and opening of our church in May 1973.

The occasion will be marked with 10am Mass and morning tea on Mother's Day, 14 May 2023.

ROCK OF AGES

By far the most distinctive feature of our parish church is the unique building material selected by Fr Leahy for its construction. Toodyay stone is a quartzite rock only found and quarried in WA.

Although Fr Leahy was new to the state when he was assigned the task of designing the church, he put great effort into understanding the natural and built environment of WA. He was fortunate that among his collaborators were Italian stonemasons, one of whom, Adriano 'Peter' Gosatti, held the quarrying licence for this superb stone.

A partner in Gosatti's other business, which supplied the team of masons, was Charlie Garreffa who headed up the on-site crew cutting and laying the stones in the shapes of Fr Leahy's bold curved walls.

On 13-14 May this year we will celebrate the 50th anniversary of Fr Leahy's achievements with a special Mass, morning tea and launch of a specially-commissioned book on the building and the dedicated Irishman behind it.

HOLY LAND - GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION

“For 800 years, the Franciscan Friars have shared the difficult lives of Christians in the countries that make up the Franciscan Custody of the Holy Land: Israel and Palestine, Egypt, Syria, Jordan, Lebanon, Rhodes, and Cyprus. The people of these countries face their own difficulties, but particularly Christians due to their minority status. Among them, the friars have never ceased offering their pastoral care. The ongoing effects of the Pandemic have created enormous challenges for the people of the Holy Land in terms of health and a catastrophic loss of income due to the absence of pilgrims. Pilgrims are vital because they generate income that allows the Friars and local Church to fulfil their mission of caring for the Holy Places (that also gives work to the local people), as well as running parishes, schools and caring for orphans, refugees, the homeless, and more. ... Brothers and sisters, the Good Friday Holy Land Collection is extremely important, and a mission that we all can assist with. The hope is that Australian parishioners, Parish Priests, and Bishops will again be as generous as they have always been. The collection is a direct way to make a difference in the lives of people who are keeping alive the Christian presence in the land of Jesus, often in the face of great odds and in recent years, made more difficult by the pandemic. ...”

REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

The Lord is portrayed as a servant, one who suffers but does not retaliate, one who is shamed but trusts beyond human commendation, who appears thwarted but remains.

Responsorial Psalm:

My God, my God, why have you abandoned me.

This poignant psalm helps us cry out to God with any abandonment that we carry and sets the scene for the reading of the Passion.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

In the defeat of death, God exalts Christ Jesus, and shows that nothing can stand between creation and the love of God.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 27:11-54

Jesus concludes his life on earth with a cry of lament that lifts into thanksgiving.

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

What is happening in today's gospel? Jesus is entering Jerusalem to take possession of the city of his ancestor, King David. But he does not come as a conquering hero on a great white horse, but humbly on a donkey. And yet Matthew tells us that the whole city is shaken to its foundations by his entrance. The whole world is about to be recreated.

Unlike other kings, Jesus exercises authority by service. He knows that soon he will be crucified, but through his death he will become the one who sends the Holy Spirit into the world for anyone willing to receive it. The Spirit will bring forgiveness of sins and make people members of the body of Christ, Jesus' brothers and sisters, adopted sons and daughters of Jesus' Father.

Through his death in obedience to his Father "all authority in heaven and on earth will be given to him" to recreate the earth and humanity.
