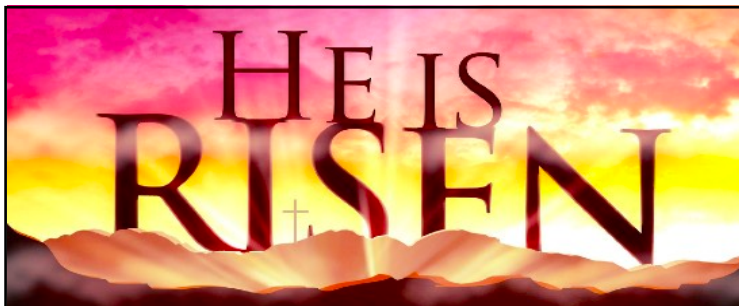

Fr Peter, Fr Tom, the Dominican Sisters and Pastoral Associate, Elle, would like to wish everyone a very happy and safe Easter.



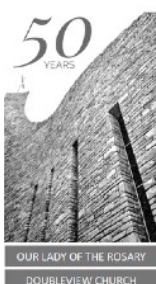

The celebration of the Passion of Our Lord was well attended this year. On Holy Thursday Fr Peter explained how Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil are liturgically one day, unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery - an introduction is given at the beginning of Holy Thursday Mass but then no dismissal or further introduction until the the Vigil Mass when we are dismissed with a joyful 'alleluia'.

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Before his ascension Jesus promised his disciples that he would be with them until the end of time. And we know what he will be doing: He will be continuing his rescue mission, his healing, and sharing the gift of his own life with the Father and the Holy Spirit. So it is still, even now, the time of "the Lord's year of favour". That was what Jesus announced in the synagogue at Nazareth at the start of his ministry on earth.

In between his birth and his rising from the dead Jesus healed the sick, cleansed lepers, forgave sin, made the lame walk, the deaf hear, the blind see – all part of his project of announcing the Lord's year of favour, the coming of the kingdom of God on earth. Our faith assures us that God will not give up caring for and rescuing his people.

So today we are celebrating, not so much a happy ending to the life of Jesus, as the fact that throughout human history, but most powerfully in the life and mission of Jesus, God has been at work on our behalf in our world, and God will not be defeated by any power that opposes him.

Just as the angel appeared to Joseph at the very beginning of the gospel and assured him that Mary's conception was not due to infidelity to him but to an invasion of divine grace and power into the world, so still today the emptiness of the tomb shows us a similar reaching out by God into our world in order to assure us that God will remain "Emmanuel", God with us, until the end of time.
