



Stone of Eternity

The story of how our church was designed and built

Stone of Eternity has been commissioned to mark the 50th anniversary of the completion and opening of Our Lady of the Rosary church in May 1973. It details the vision of its designer and builder Fr Bonaventure Leahy OP, describes the key biographic threads of his life (1920-1990) and includes interviews with contractors and parishioners who worked on the project. The book's 15 chapters are illustrated with contemporary and historical photographs and sample documents. Readers will learn about the Doubleview parish church's unique architecture, artworks and fittings, some of the remarkable people who accompanied Leahy on his mission and the priest's divine inspiration, humility and personal sacrifices.

Publication proceeds after costs will go to the Our Lady of the Rosary Foundation to aid the ongoing preservation of the church building.

<u>A READING FROM THE HOLY</u> GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN

Jesus said: 'I tell you most solemnly, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold through the gate, but gets in some other way is a thief and brigand. The one who enters through the gate is the shepherd of the flock; the gatekeeper lets him in, the sheep hear his voice, one by one he calls his own sheep and leads them out. When he has brought out his flock, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow because they know his voice. They never follow a stranger but run away from him: they do not recognise the voice of strangers.'

Jesus told them this parable but they failed to understand what he meant by telling it to them.

So Jesus spoke to them again:

'I tell you most solemnly, I am the gate of the sheepfold. All others who have come are thieves and brigands; but the sheep took no notice of them. I am the gate. Anyone who enters through me will be safe: he will go freely in and out and be sure of finding pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full.' Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

In today's gospel Jesus is telling us that the role he plays in our lives is similar to the function of the gate into the sheepfold for a first century flock of sheep. That sounds strange. But that is what Jesus is saying.

The gate was important because it could be locked to protect the sheep during the night, and it was also the only way for the shepherd to lead them out each morning to find good pasture with the sustenance they needed to stay healthy.



The comparison of Jesus to the gate makes sense to us to the extent that we ever feel in need of protection from some threat to our well-being, especially our relationship with the Father. And it also speaks to our need to stay together as a community where we can support each other and receive together the sustenance we need for a good life.

So Jesus wants us to feel safe in each other's company with him caring for us. As he says in the last verse of the gospel, he came among us that we may have life, "and have it abundantly," and he is thinking principally of God's life that he wants to share with us. Fr. Tom



The Organ Society of WA is particularly proud of our church and the pipe organ it features.

Most of the organ, made by the Hufner family a century ago, once resided in the Central Baptist church in Northbridge, demolished to make way for the State Library in the early 1970s.

Other pipework has interesting and unlikely origins. Some came from a Wurlitzer installed in the 1910s in Fremantle's Princess Theatre. And a few extra pipes were manufactured by a Dutch company, Jacques Stinkens, at the same time they were contributing components for the organ in the Sydney Opera House which also opened in 1973.

Next month our pipe organ will be played during the celebration of our building's 50th anniversary Mass. It's part of a weekend of events on 13-14 May outlined in this newsletter.
