

A church for the ages

In the half century since the parish church of Our Lady of the Rosary was opened, it has rightly gained a reputation as one of the most beautiful places of worship in the country.

This weekend we mark that anniversary with joy and enduring gratitude.

Our focus is on the designer and building supervisor Fr Bonaventure Leahy OP (1920-1990) and on the many committed people who worked alongside him to realise a magnificent vision.

The building is both a product of its time - embracing sweeping liturgical reforms post Vatican II – and a structure that never ages.

Fr Leahy believed that the reason every detail in the church was the way it was "is because God is God".

Over 50 years, our parish can truly reflect on the central role this church has played in our community. It has been witness to many milestones in our lives, a setting for spiritual renewal and a venue for major events.



Many who have visited the church for worship or reflection will have felt the way the walls and the artworks surround you with peace.

It will always stand as the hero of Toodyay stone structures, delivering a wonder of graceful design and bold construction.

Our new book, *Stone of Eternity*, commissioned for the anniversary, pays tribute to the inspired pioneers of the project and takes readers behind the scenes of the era in which a large suburban bush block was transformed into a timeless hub for prayer and the Blessed Sacrament.

The weekend's celebrations unite so many in honouring a unique achievement from 1973 which will continue to serve parishioners and visitors for scores of decades to come.

Dear Parishioners and Visitors

Sometimes we hear things but can't tell what's making the sound. We might think we hear a plane flying overhead, but it turns out to be a truck passing on the street. Then again sometimes we think we see a friend on the other side of the street, but it turns out to be someone we don't know.

There are stories like that in the gospels. One tells how Jesus appeared to Mary Magdalen outside his tomb on the morning of the Resurrection, but Mary thought he was the gardener. Another story St Luke tells us is about two disciples who give up hope in Jesus after they see him crucified in Jerusalem and are walking away from the city. Jesus joins them on their journey and explains how his Passion and death were foretold in the Old Testament. But the two travellers only come to recognise that it is Jesus who is speaking to them when they finally reach their destination and Jesus breaks bread with them

The point is that we can and do have experiences of hearing, seeing, tasting and feeling without knowing what is causing them. In a somewhat similar way, we can hear Jesus speaking to us when the Gospel is read to us at Mass, or we can receive him in the Eucharist, or we can meet him in the poor and needy, in our family and neighbours, and even in ourselves, without recognising that Jesus is actually trying to share himself with us and deepen our relationship with him.

In the gospel today Jesus tells his disciples that he will soon be leaving them. He will be crucified, rise from the dead, and return to his Father in Heaven. His disciples will no longer see him with their eyes, but they will be able to recognise his presence among them when the Scriptures are read, in Holy Communion, in the poor and in each other. Fr.
