

#### LETTER TO PARISHIONERS

Dear parishioners,

This is a difficult letter but one which I feel needs to be written. Unfortunately, we are aware that over recent months several parents of young children have experienced an issue at Mass, when someone told them or indicated with a gesture that they should keep their children quiet and still. I know two of the young mothers personally and they were quite distressed by their experience.

The Parish Pastoral Council is focused on supporting our parish to be inclusive and welcoming and this situation does not appear to demonstrate those values. Surely, we all strive to be like Jesus, who said "Let the children come to me...for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these". As you know, we have just celebrated the 50th anniversary of our church. If we don't encourage families to attend Mass and participate in parish life, in the future our church may be just a building rather than the centre of our parish community. For parents, if you have a particularly restless child I encourage you to move to the back of the church, which I believe mostly happens already. For others, if you find that you are seated near a family at Mass and you think it may be distracting, perhaps you could simply move to another seat. If you would like to discuss this further with Fr Peter or me you are welcome to contact the office to make an appointment.





#### **TODAY'S READINGS:**

First Reading: Exodus 34:4b-6, 8-9

The reading from Exodus is taken from section commonly titled 'The Renewal of the Tablets' where the Lord re-writes the Decalogue after they had been broken. God's mercy and faithfulness is declared.

Responsorial Psalm: Daniel 3:52-56

Glory and praise for ever!

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 13:11-13

One of the clearest trinitarian passages of the Scriptures forms our second reading. Our ecclesial family is to be a reflection of the love of the three Persons of the Trinity.

Gospel Reading: John 3:16-18

We hear from today's Gospel reading one of the most foundational statements of the Christian faith; Jesus Christ, the Son, is the love of God the Father poured out in totality, sent into the world not to condemn, but to save it.

#### A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN

Jesus said to Nicodemus,

'God loved the world so much

that he gave his only Son,

so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost

but may have eternal life.

For God sent his Son into the world

not to condemn the world,

but so that through him the world might be saved.

No one who believes in him will be condemned:

But whoever refuses to believe is condemned already,

because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son.'

#### **COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL**

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Most of us have probably had the pleasant experience, as either children or adults, of being accepted as part of an already formed group of friends. It's a great feeling, being accepted by other people we like. And something similar happens, doesn't it, when a child is born into a loving family? The child becomes increasingly aware of being loved and accepted and valued.

Well, it is certainly a fact that the earliest Christian believers felt they were being drawn into the unique relationship that Jesus obviously experienced between himself and the God he called "Father." Jesus delighted in that relationship, and often spoke to his Father in prayer, and the gospels give us examples of the Father showing his affection for Jesus. At his baptism in the River Jordan by John the Baptist, and at the Transfiguration on the mountain top, the Father expressed his love for Jesus as his "beloved Son."

I think it helps to understand today's feast of the Blessed Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, if we think about a child's relationship to its family, or our relationship to our closest friends. The Gospel makes it clear that the Blessed Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, wants us to share their life. That's what begins at our baptism but, like all relationships, it is meant to grow. That's one reason why we keep coming back to Mass, to nourish the divine life we received at Baptism, to deepen our relationship with the Father, the Son Jesus, and the Holy Spirit.
