

# **LETTER TO PARISHIONERS**

Dear parishioners,

This is a difficult letter but one which I feel needs to be written. Unfortunately, we are aware that over recent months several parents of young children have experienced an issue at Mass, when someone told them or indicated with a gesture that they should keep their children quiet and still. I know two of the young mothers personally and they were quite distressed by their experience.

The Parish Pastoral Council is focused on supporting our parish to be inclusive and welcoming and this situation does not appear to demonstrate those values. Surely, we all strive to be like Jesus, who said "Let the children come to me...for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these". As you know, we have just celebrated the 50th anniversary of our church. If we don't encourage families to attend Mass and participate in parish life, in the future our church may be just a building rather than the centre of our parish community. For parents, if you have a particularly restless child I encourage you to move to the back of the church, which I believe mostly happens already. For others, if you find that you are seated near a family at Mass and you think it may be distracting, perhaps you could simply move to another seat. If you would like to discuss this further with Fr Peter or me you are welcome to contact the office to make an appointment.

### **TODAY'S READINGS:**

#### First Reading: Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14-16

The passage from Deuteronomy reminds the people of God that the Lord cares for them. They are encouraged to remember that God provided for them in their time of need and did so in new ways, for God gave them food that their ancestors did not know.

A song of praise for our God, who provides a place of security and nourishment.

#### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:16-17

Though we are many, we are formed into one body through the sharing of the body of Christ.

### Gospel Reading: John 6:51-58

Leading up to the passage of today's Gospel reading John 6, Jesus has evoked the imagery of manna provided to the Jewish ancestors in the desert. Like that provision, Jesus is a gift from God, given freely to satisfy the needs of many in ways that go beyond any blessing that has come before. Jesus is the 'living bread from heaven'.

# A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN

Jesus said to the Jews:

'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven.

Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.'

Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' They said. Jesus replied:

'I tell you most solemnly,

if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood,

you will not have life in you.

Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood

has eternal life,

and I shall raise him up on the last day.

For my flesh is real food

and my blood is real drink.

He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me

and I live in him.

As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father,

so whoever eats me will draw life from me.

This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate:

they are dead,

but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

When you were very young did your father ever give you some money to buy a present for your mother for her birthday? Or maybe your mother gave you some money to buy a birthday present for your father. That is what happened in my family, and I suspect it was a fairly common practice in the 1940's. I think this can help us understand what the Eucharist is all about, which is what we are celebrating today.

We enjoy giving presents to those we love. The Scriptures make it clear that God likes giving us things – human life to begin with, then a share in his own divine life leading us to eternal happiness, and everything in between. But what can we possibly give God in return? The answer can only be something he has already given us.

At Mass Jesus, God's Son, becomes present to us as the Body and Blood of Christ. St Paul tells us that we have been like members of that Body since our baptism. So it is *our* Body. As such, we are one with Christ's offering of Himself to the Father, which is what becomes present for us at Mass. He is the gift we offer to God the Father. We become part of that self-offering Jesus made to the Father on Calvary.
