

SPECIAL FEAST



This feast was observed on this date in the fourth century. It celebrates the holy birth of 'the greatest of all the prophets,' the one who leapt for joy in his mother's womb, who prepared the way for the Christ, announced his presence, and baptised him in the Jordan River.


John the Baptist spent his adult life preparing the way for Jesus, and proclaiming that "the Kingdom of Heaven is close at hand." He was born to Zachary and Elizabeth, an elderly married couple. The Angel Gabriel had visited Zachary and told him that his wife would bear a child, even though she was already past the child-bearing age.

Elizabeth was Mary's cousin and Zachary was a priest of the Temple in Jerusalem. As a baby in the womb, John recognized Jesus' presence in Mary's womb when Mary visited Elizabeth soon after the Annunciation. Both women were pregnant at the same time.

John was probably born at Ain-Karim, which is southwest of Jerusalem. As a young adult, he lived as a hermit in the desert of Judea until about A.D. 27. When he was 30, he began to preach on the banks of the Jordan, calling for repentance and baptising people in the river waters. When Jesus came to John to be baptised, John recognised Jesus as the Messiah and baptised Him, saying: "It is I who need baptism from you."

John continued to preach after Jesus was baptised, but was imprisoned not long after by Herod Antipas, after he denounced the king's adulterous marriage with Herodias, wife of his half-brother Philip.

John was beheaded at the request of Salome, daughter of Herodias. Many came to know Jesus through John, namely the Apostles Andrew and John.

TODAY'S READINGS:

First Reading: Exodus 19:2-6

On eagles' wings God has borne us, enabling us to be a holy nation capable of bearing others.

Responsorial Psalm: Ps

We are his people: the sheep of his flock.

This psalm echoes the Exodus reading when it calls the people to obey their God and so be cared for in the best possible way. This also follows through in the gospel in Jesus' compassion for the sheep without a shepherd.

Second Reading: Romans:

As Christ is our reconciliation, so in him we are to be reconciliation in our world.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 9:36-10:8

Jesus turns his compassion for the people into a ministry of healing, care and belonging for the sick, the dying and the ritually outcast. This is an apostolic church.

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

When Jesus saw the crowds he felt sorry for them because they were harassed and dejected, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest.'

He summoned his twelve disciples, and gave them authority over unclean spirits with power to cast them out and to cure all kinds of diseases and sickness.

These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas, and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, the one who was to betray him. These twelve Jesus sent out, instructing them as follows:

'Do not turn your steps to pagan territory, and do not enter any Samaritan town; go rather to the lost sheep of the House of Israel. And as you go, proclaim that the kingdom of heaven is close at hand. Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out devils. You received without charge, give without charge.

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

Dear Parishioners and Visitors.

I think the challenge in today's gospel is to really believe that Jesus was overwhelmed by compassion at the sight of the crowds who were following him around and listening to him and asking for healing. His immediate compassionate response was to send his apprentice disciples among them to continue his healing and preaching mission. The disciples themselves were also challenged to believe that they too were in a familial relationship with Jesus' Father in heaven, who cared about them and was powerful enough to look after them.

What about us? We are called to play our role in the same mission as Jesus, to bring compassionate help to all who are suffering and to show at least by example what kind of life becomes possible for those who believe in Jesus. Two things are necessary if we are to accept Jesus' challenge. One is to really believe that God will care for us, and the other is how much the Father cares for all those we try to help in any way.
