# STS PETER & PAUL, APOSTLES - 29 JUNE

Saints Peter and Paul are considered the foundational pillars of the Church. Peter represents the stability of the Church and the office of the Vicar of Christ. Paul represents the mission of evangelization that was entrusted to the Church by Jesus Himself. He was also the Church's first theologian, which is seen in his numerous letters that expound on the Gospels. Though unlikely, one tradition states that they were both martyred on June 29, in Rome, making them twin martyrs. Their twin martyrdom reminds us that the Church must be both stable and mission-oriented. It must remain grounded in the ancient Truth, yet grow and flower with an ongoing understanding of the mysteries of faith. [My Catholic Life]


# 4 DAY HAWES HERITAGE TRAIL PILGRIMAGE - 20TH-23RD AUGUST \$300 PER PERSON

# A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: 'Do not be afraid. For everything that is now covered will be uncovered, and everything now hidden will be made clear. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the daylight; what you hear in whispers, proclaim from the house-tops.

'Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; fear him rather who can destroy both body and soul in hell. Can you not buy two sparrows for a penny? And yet not one falls to the ground without your Father knowing. Why, every hair on your head has been counted. So there is no need to be afraid; you are worth more than hundreds of sparrows.

'So if anyone declares himself for me in the presence of men, I will declare myself for him in the presence of my Father in heaven. But the one who disowns me in the presence of men, I will disown in the presence of my Father in heaven.'

# **COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL**

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Today's gospel is the central passage in Jesus' instructions to his twelve disciples before he sends them out to continue his own healing and preaching ministry - the Father who cares even for sparrows puts the highest value on believers.

Being a disciple of Jesus is demanding and challenging and difficult. A secure sense of being highly valued, even to enjoying a familial relationship with Jesus' Father in heaven, makes it possible and helps to balance the fears and difficulties of life.

When you think about it, fear, being afraid, insecure, uncertain about so many things, even being threatened by sickness, failure and finally death, is a part of life for every one of us.



Hopefully, we have already experienced the difference it makes to this situation when we are already conscious of being loved, cared about, wanted, valued by other people. Jesus is saying that our experience of life is very different if we are deeply conscious of being cared for by a God who loves us more than we can understand and will do anything to enable us to reach the final fullness of life with Himself in heaven. That is what he gave his life for.
