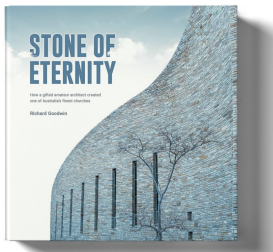
Sea Sunday 9th July

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

How will we find rest for our souls by shouldering the yoke that Jesus is offering us? Taking Jesus' yoke means above all loving God and our neighbour. And we all know that that is not easy. It means cheerfully accepting the crosses that come our way in our daily lives. It means that all sin is basically a failure to love. Or even more basically, failing to love is sinful.

So what is the good news today? It must be that Jesus is thinking of the eternal happiness of sharing God's glory in heaven. The trials of this life will appear as nothing when we receive the gift of eternal life for which we were created.

But that is not all. We all know that life's troubles and challenges are greatly diminished when we know that someone we love is sharing them with us. That is surely the meaning of the crucifix that we have in our homes and churches. Jesus suffered for us that we might have eternal life. His suffering and ours is all part of the same mystery by which we are being prepared and made fit for eternal life. This is what St. Paul meant when he spoke of bearing one another's burdens and so fulfilling Christ's law of love.
